Information about Pupil Premium Students and Their Progress (2011 – 2012)

What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium grant to schools refers to additional funding given to schools to support the students on its roll who come from a services family, are in care and those who receive free school meals (FSM). Schools are expected to use the Pupil Premium to support the progress of these students and are required to publish information on how the Pupil Premium is being spent, together with an evaluation of the impact it is having on the progress and achievement of Pupil Premium students.
