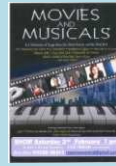

BIKE MARKING

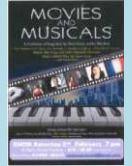


Thames Valley Police is holding a bike marking event on Saturday 2 February at Tesco, Pinchington Lane, Newbury. They will be in

LIVING FOR SPORT ATHLETE MENTOR VISIT, 11 JANUARY

As part of the Living for Sport scheme we were delighted to welcome Lesley Owusu to St Bart's. Lesley is a highly accomplished international athlete who has competed at the European, World and commonwealth stages. She is a former 400m British Champion and still remains the British and European record holder for the 600 yard dash.

Lesley had kindly agreed to spend the day with us and was keen to involve herself with a variety of students. She started off by leading an athletic/fitness session on the STP with a group of Year 11 students, which they thoroughly enjoyed. She then led an assembly with 9C/D who enjoyed her presentation and question and answer session, along with the opportunity to hold a selection of gold, silver and bronze medals. Throughout the assembly it was clearly evident that Lesley is passionate about making a positive difference in young people's lives and helping them to believe in themselves and fulfil their potential; her presentation clearly reflected the hard work and dedication she had put in throughout her life to get to and achieve the high levels of success. Interestingly, one of the athletics competitions she was first noticed at by numerous coaches was the TSB athletics competition which is now known as the Schools Cup Competition and one in which we compete every year.

Lesley finished her day with an afternoon with the Year 10 Living for Sport group (pictured) who benefited from a presentation followed by a practical session in the sports hall.



The boys enjoyed listening to Lesley's experiences, the highs and lows and understood how determination and courage plays a large part in success. Lesley was due to compete in the London 2012 Olympics, but

unfortunately due to injury this was not possible. Another window opened and she was asked to be part of the commentating team for the athletics, for both the Olympics and Paralympics competitions, so amid the disappointment of not being able to compete there was also the high of being asked to commentate.

"Always believe that you can achieve and be the best that you can be," said Lesley Owusu.
