Author Visit

Never mind World Book Day, it is more like World Book Month at St Bart's. Key Stage 3 students will be treated to a variety of extra-curricular English and Library activities this month. These include a special visit by Mark Lowery, author of 'Socks are not Enough.' Mark will be speaking to Year 7 and 8 students about his writing, and sharing some tips about how to become a successful author.

Accelerated Reader

Year 8 also celebrate the launch of Accelerated Reader this month. This is a new programme designed to encourage wider reading and measure progress in our students.
