ROCK AND POP FOUNDATION

In a recent whole school assembly students were told of the opportunities offered by the Rock & Pop Foundation, which will offer students musical development skills alongside those offered by Berkshire Maestros. Below is a summary of the programme and qualifications offered. If any student is interested in taking up this opportunity, they can collect an application form from Mr Grant in the Music Department.

The Rock and Pop Foundation is an instrumental tuition programme, which takes young people's music development to the next level of writing and performing as a band.

Young performers will develop skills in music by writing their own songs as a band from the foundation's own specially developed syllabus.

This syllabus is a web based platform and on completion, students will gain an NVQ Level 1 qualification that also supports GCSE Music. At KS2-3 it is estimated to take 18-24 months to complete and for KS4, it can be complete in as little as 12 months (depending on the skills set of the musicians and rehearsal times). The exam is a video journal submitted online.

Lessons are in groups with each band consisting of: two guitarists, a bass player, a keyboardist and a drummer. It will cost £9.77 per week payable in advance each term. 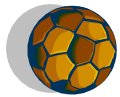
