SCHOOL UNIFORM Years 7 - 11



As reported in BartholoNews on 4 March, the online retailer for school uniform has changed. We are pleased to confirm that Trutex Direct is now offering school uniform items, including the St Bart's school blazer, skirt and trousers as well as shirts and blouses. The images of the school shirts and blouses which appear on the Trutex Direct website are generic to all schools and the ties shown in these pictures are not part of the St Bart's uniform.

Please note that this online company is a completely separate business from the high street retailer in Bartholomew Street, Trutex Schoolwear and More, whose excellent service remains unchanged. They continue to offer all items for St Bart's, including school ties and PE kit.

If you would like to purchase items from the online service log onto www.trutexdirect.com and at the password prompt type in LEA00631SC. This information is also on the school uniform page of the St Bart's website.

Delivery from Trutex Direct is just £2.55, or free for orders above £40. Any returns and exchanges are free using the special returns bag that comes with each order.

Trutex Direct will normally deliver all orders within seven working days. However, during the busiest time, just before the new term in September, this delivery time can be extended so it is recommended that you place any orders for the start of the new school year before 8 August. Whilst every effort will be made to satisfy all orders, Trutex Direct cannot guarantee delivery in time for the new term after this date.

In addition to the two St Bart's uniform suppliers, parents/carers are able to purchase second hand items of uniform through the Parents' Association Second Hand Uniform Shop which is open on Fridays during term time from 3.00-3.45pm just inside the student entrance at school. Appointments can also be arranged through your child's House office.

Both the junior and inter girls athletics teams performed brilliantly at the recent Schools Cup Competition scoring some excellent individual and team results. The girls performed with drive and determination and their efforts were justly rewarded with some super results leading to both teams being selected to go through to the Regional B finals at Yeovil on Monday 9 June.
