

AIMING HIGH: YEAR 12 FACE THE 'CHAMPIONS OF ENTERPRISE' CHALLENGE

Champions of Enterprise is just one of the ways in which the school aims to help our Sixth Formers develop key skills which are important not only for their time in further education but also in today's competitive job market.



This whole day event, run by the Education Business Partnership involved all of Year 12 and required each student team to assume the role of "investor" with a money pot of £10,000 to invest in a local business. Their task was to assess the three genuine businesses presented to them at the start of the day, analyse their strengths and weaknesses, produce a SWOT analysis, and then decide which one to invest in and why.

The challenge culminated in each team presenting to a panel of judges who had the job of assessing their analyses of the three businesses, their reasons for investing the way they did as well as their overall presentation skills. Six teams were then chosen to go through to day two of the challenge which involved improving on their presentation from day one and included an extra task.

An important element of the challenge was the presence of business mentors, including representation from the three companies involved – Hartwood Oak, Environmental Solutions and Ntegra - who all volunteered their time to help and give advice to the teams throughout the challenge.

At the end of day two there could only be one winner and so our congratulations go to Christian Hudson-Pearson, Alex Lovell, Ben Butterworth and Lewis Tredinnick (12C3) who will now go on to represent St Bart's in the final to be held on 1 December.



Y10 Rugby v Reading Boys' School

On Thursday 25 of September, the Year 10 St Bart's rugby team returned to Reading Boys' School after defeating the same team the year before. A narrow victory last year was no guarantee of a triumph this year however, so the team came into this match fierce and ready to fight for the chance to proceed in the Berkshire Cup.

The match began positively when early in the match Finn Chambers nicked a try. Then Tom Allum broke the Reading defensive line to carry the ball



within five metres of the try line, and Tom Murrell was on his shoulder to collect the offload and score the try. Tom Murrell then crossed the white line again, and soon after Max Hayman got his name on the score sheet. Joe Seward was given plenty of practice with his conversions in the first half, and showed accuracy and distance to score all four opportunities to put us up 28-0. In the last play of the first half however, Reading managed to bundle the ball over the try line and pull back five points to make the half-time score 28-5.

At the beginning of the second half Reading stole another try after the ball spilled out of the side of the ruck. Thankfully, the St Bart's boys did not let their heads drop, and responded via tries from Max Carnell and then Finn Chambers. Tom Webster then took five points from the back of a scrum before Tom Allum took his well-deserved score. Will Hutchins then concluded his powerful running with a try for himself. In the second half Joe Seward had continued his exemplary display of kicking with a final points tally of fourteen after scoring seven out of nine kicks.
