

AN EVACUEE AT ST BART'S

The recent anniversary of VE Day coincided with a visit to St Bart's by a war time evacuee, Pauline Durnford. Pauline, who is Miss Midgley's fiancé's grandmother, was evacuated to Newbury from Canterbury and attended a primary school set up in the Baptist church for a year before moving to Newbury Girls' School. She was keen to look around the new buildings and see how life at the school has changed. Pauline was interviewed by Sanskriti Sahoo and James Oakes in 7E2.



We interviewed Pauline Durnford on Friday 15 May asking her what life was like at St Bart's during World War 2. It was interesting to find out about the different routines and ways of doing things.

We asked her what she thought about the change from separate boys and girls schools to a mixed comprehensive. We had a thumbs up from her as she said it was a very good thing to have this.

To a lot of us, food is very important, so we asked Pauline what food was like with rationing. We were told that the food was extremely bland with no spices and not a lot of flavour. We asked about lessons and it turns out that they had to learn Latin and didn't have lessons in construction, German, Spanish and Mandarin. They could only go to the boys' school to study science and this was whilst the boys were doing PE. A surprising thing is that they didn't have Houses; they only had colours which they used for the sports teams.

I think we could all agree that life in the war was quite hard; leaving your home and parents and joining a new school. Pauline was very brave and should be commended for facing these challenges and we would like to thank her for coming in to talk to us.

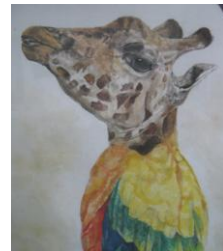

YEAR 10 CRICKET COUNTY CUP SUCCESS

The Year 10 team made a great start in the county cup with an 111 run victory over Theale Green. The star of the day was captain James Bird who, having been put into bat, soon made the visitors regret their decision. James retired on 100 runs which included eight impressive 6s and beat his previous career best of 98.



Jamie Maughan was the next best with the bat with a cultured 25 halted by a successful LBW appeal.

The 186 runs allowed the team to experiment with the bowling attack and it was great to see strength in depth as Fionn Grady claimed 4 wickets, Finn Chambers 2 and James Bird, Tom Murrell and Oli Harvey all taking one. In addition special mention should go to Jake Mavis and his run out.

The Year 10 lost to Kennet in their first league game with a few big names absent for what is always a close match. Man of the match Ollie Smithson marked his return to the team by taking an off stump ripper with his first delivery and then repeated the trick with his first deliver in his third over by catching out the dangerous Kennet opener. Ollie capped his performance with a late batting cameo sending the ball sweetly over the boundary four times in his undefeated 20.

The match seemed to be in our control with Kennet only having 13 runs after 5 eight ball overs and seeing their second and third batsman going for ducks. Their opener Williams (21) and number four Wells (42 not out) however started to find a rhythm and built a strong innings. James Bird broke the deadlock with two fine wickets and Jake Mavis took three important wickets with his final 5 delivers. The whole team contributed with the bat with James Bird hitting the biggest 6 of the day and Tom Murrell a well timed cover drive for 4 but ultimately the team could not find the 114 required. The team now have a clear focus on redemption with the target to win their remaining league games and face the same opponents in the play off league final.

Girls' English Schools Track and Field Cup Tuesday 12 May at Palmer Park

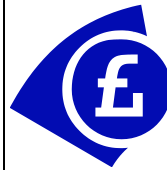
