MY SUMMER WITH THE NATIONAL YOUTH THEATRE OF GREAT BRITAIN

I decided to audition for NYT at the beginning of this year, because it had an amazing reputation for producing British talent - alumni include Helen Mirren, Chiwetel Ejiofor, Daniel Day Lewis and Rosamund Pike. My audition was in Bristol in February and involved a three hour workshop in the morning followed by an individual audition in the afternoon where I performed my chosen monologue. It was the most fun and informative audition I have ever done and I came out afterwards already wanting to go back next year if I was unsuccessful. On 23 May after an agonisingly long wait, audition results were emailed to hopefuls all over the country – and I got a place on the junior intake acting course! Around 4500 young people auditioned (both for the senior and junior courses) and around 300 14-17 year olds gained a place on the junior course so I was very lucky and extremely excited.

During the run up to the course I managed to raise the £1200 needed to cover the costs of the course, accommodation and living expenses for two weeks in Greenwich. I would like to thank everyone at school (including staff, the Parents' Association and my friends

and fellow students and their families) who supported my sponsored walk and the various stalls I ran at school events - your generosity was overwhelming.

On 3 August I travelled to Greenwich to check into the student accommodation we'd be staying in and meet some of the rest of Course 6 (our group of 30 within the 300 junior members) for the first time. The next weeks with my NYT family passed in a blur of creative fun, inspiration and learning and they were definitely the best two weeks of my life. I learnt so much in such a short space of time, for example how to work as a large ensemble (our group created a breathing, speaking crocodile from 60 people in the final performance!) and the level of focus that was needed in a professional company. We also improved on previously learnt skills, spending two separate days doing improvisation and a Shakespeare workshop (these were both invaluable). New skills were introduced too by visiting professionals, such as puppetry and using the voice in theatre to create soundscapes.



During my time in London I also became much more independent, sharing a flat with five other girls from Course 6 and cooking for ourselves – although there were a lot of microwave meals involved! Essentially we got a taste of university life during the two weeks there, which will hopefully be useful in the future.

Overall this experience was so valuable in terms of learning what is involved in being part of a professional theatre company. Thank you so much to the school for all their support in so many different ways and I am so excited for all the opportunities NYT might give me over my next ten years as one of their members.

The national figure for '**Persistent Absence**' is now set at 90%. This is the point at which the Education Welfare Service work with the school to actively monitor attendance in order to support improved attendance.

Self Certification

We are introducing a 'Self Certification' form to be used where students are absent for a maximum of three school days. This will be trialled through the autumn term.

Leave of Absence

If there is an unavoidable reason that your child needs to request an absence from school, please request a Leave of Absence form from the House office. The request will be considered by the Headteacher and a reply returned to you, noting whether the absence is authorised or unauthorised.

Please note that requests for holidays will always be unauthorised.

Absences in excess of 20 sessions (where a session represents half a day), over a ten week period may incur a **Fixed Penalty Fine**.
