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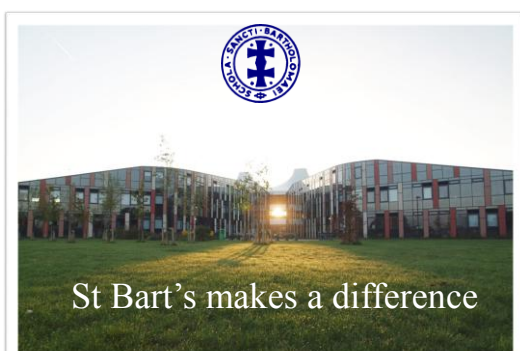
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## OPEN EVENING

## BIOLOGY IN UGANDA – SUMMER 2015



A field trip of a lifetime was experienced by a group of Sixth Form students over the summer when they embarked on an expedition to Uganda organised by Mr Pattenden through a specialist company, Far Frontiers.

The primates of Kibale Forest were a main focus of the trip and there were dozens of sightings in the jungle which included the Red Colobus, a critically endangered species in all



other areas of Africa. Other primates spotted were Blue Monkeys, Red-Tailed Monkeys, Baboons and at night, Greater Bush-Babies and a Potto.

The students got involved with trapping birds in mist nets, or attracting butterflies or rodents to fruit-based bait, which provided lots of opportunities for photos.



Another highlight was chimpanzee tracking which involved a reasonably vigorous walk on steep slopes, through dense forest. At the top of a fruiting tree were two female chimpanzees and a baby, all too preoccupied with eating to take any notice of the St Bart's group watching them in fascination.



Travelling around the area meant driving along dirt roads, through villages and farms, tea plantations and estates and seeing the villagers go about their daily life. Bananas and pineapples were piled high on bicycles to be transported for sale.



The expedition included a safari at Queen Elizabeth



National Park introducing the group to elephants, lions, buffalo, warthogs, antelopes and many others. The Kasinga channel cruise produced views of incredible richness, with herds of hippos, buffalo, crocodiles and all manner of birds.

The final trip before departing for home was to cross the equator and pose for the group photograph.



The next Far Frontiers biology expedition is to Vietnam in 2016. There are still some spaces available. More information from Mr Pattenden in the science faculty.
