The XV squad have had an excellent start to the season. At the pre season tournament against local schools they beat the favourites The Downs School in their opening fixture as James Lewis scored the decisive try in the last play after heroic defence in the difficult wet conditions. It was very promising as we also played a large number of players

who have not represented the school before; impressive tries were scored by J Bhatt, B Morgan, S Ansell, S Watt and J De Toit.

On Saturday the first team **beat Windsor Boys' 11 – 5** to keep their momentum going. Windsor could not believe the onslaught they faced at Enborne Road in particular through MOTM S Ansell, Captain A Lockhart, S Eva and Barney Morgan. Windsor defence was impressive and they managed to hold their line so our dominance resulted in a three point advantage. Against the run of play after two loose kicks Windsor went ahead. St Bart's replied immediately and the backs linked well to put Y11 T Webster into space to race in to give us the lead again. To ease the nerves B Morgan took a penalty to see the game out for a well deserved win.

On Wednesday the 1<sup>st</sup> XV **beat Kennet school 36 – 10** in the second round of the National Cup. Having started well it was against the run of play that kennet scored the first try after a series of well executed off loads.
