TAKING FURTHER

MATHS

On Friday 16 October, ten Year 10 Further Maths students went on a trip to Wellington College to take part in a 'Taking Maths Further' day.

The trip included a number of talks and activities, the first of which was designed to show the array of benefits to be gained through taking Maths through to A Level and Higher Education. It really opened the students' eyes to where Maths could take their careers.

In the second session, on Game Theory and Dating Strategies, we discovered how probability calculations, logic and reasoning applied to Cold War strategies and banking/finance.

In the next session of the morning we did some cryptology, starting off with PIGPEN (letters are represented by shapes/positions in a grid), then went on to crack codes written in other, harder ciphers.

The final session led us to find out about randomness, and how ridiculously difficult it is to select a truly random set of numbers.

Lunch was great and was then followed by a Maths quiz/relay where we all worked with students from other schools. St Bart's had students in the winning team and one of the runners up too.

Overall a good time was had by all.

YEAR 9 : RELATIONSHIPS AND SEX EDUCATION
