## MP VISIT TO ST BART'S

Last week we reported that Richard Benyon, MP visited the Sixth Form. A report on this interesting session follows.



During our Enrichment session on 28 January our local MP, Richard Benyon, spoke to Year 12 and some Year 13 students about politics. He first began by talking through a typical day in Parliament, which he described as not very typical, but very long. He then discussed local issues such as the under-occupancy penalty and broadband access, which he is currently seeking to improve.

On the spot questions were put to him by students from both years. Mr Benyon was asked about a wide range of issues such as Jeremy Corbyn, bombing Syria, nuclear weapons and the EU referendum. He even discussed Donald Trump. He also admitted he would be against lowering the voting age, even if it's just to 17 years.

He informed us that he had managed to change a train timetable so that students could get to school on time, so encouraged us to contact him about any problems we noticed in the local area, or even further afield, saying he would do his best to help.

Perhaps, more importantly, he was encouraging young people to participate in politics and to use our vote.
