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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

This term was marked by the recognition we received from the Department for Education through the letter from Nick Gibb, Minister

of State for Schools, congratulating us on the high standard of achievement of our students in their GCSEs last year. The percentage of students gaining five or more GCSEs at A*-C, including English and Mathematics, and the percentage of students achieving the EBacc, put us in the top 100 non-selective state-funded schools in England – that is in the top 3% of schools on both measures.

This was excellent news and a result of the hard work and dedication of our students and staff. As a school we always encourage all of our students to achieve their best, and we will continue to build on this success.

Term Highlights

One of the highlights of this term was last week, seeing so many students join in our activities to raise money for Sport Relief – see page 5. My thanks go to the PE Department and Sixth Form School Officers for organising the events.

It has also been pleasing to see so many students and staff involved in many other activities across the school. Many of these have been featured in BartholoNews and assemblies this term, including Science Week, World Book Day, BBC School Report Day, Pi Day and the Spring Concert. House competitions were also closely fought and the standard of performances has been extremely high. Patterson won both House Drama and House Dance competitions, Curnock won the Junior House Debating and Evers won the

Senior House Debating. It always makes me so proud to see the exceptional talent and achievements of our students that contribute to the great school we are.
