Staff and students took part in activities for World Book Day on 3 March. Students enjoyed completing quizzes whilst staff had dressed for the occasion as a favourite book character for the costume competition.



## SOCIOLOGY VISIT

### Year 12

Year 12 students studying Sociology visited the V&A Childhood Museum in London to develop their knowledge and understanding of the A Level course topic.

On arrival we explored the museum, enabling us to complete the worksheets. The museum was filled with toys from a range of different eras, including some we had as children, such as Tamagotchi. By looking at these displays we were able to develop our knowledge and we were provided with rich information to use in the classroom.

After a good lunch at the cafe in the museum we moved onto a session involved with finding evidence. The topic was on Britain's Child Migrants, which is a sensitive issue, but important to our course. The museum showed us pictures from historians who used primary and secondary sources to build an image of events in the past. We were given various statements and required to find the evidence to decide whether these were correct or not. This provided us with the opportunity to learn about child migration and emphasised the importance of good research methods.

Finally we attended a talk on Childhood. This explained the journey of childhood beginning from the 1700s and helped us understand how the definition of childhood has changed over time, linking it to the school leaving age from being 12, to 15 and now 18.

We were shown pictures of toys children have played with over the years and it raised questions about the reasons behind the types of toys. For instance we linked children playing 'medicine' to the fact many died at a very young age of 10 or 11 due to lack of medical advances.

The session illustrated how schooling has changed over this period of time, as well

as the clothing worn. It was normal for boys at infant school age to wear dresses.

At primary school age children were usually separated into single sex schools and

illustrations showed that lunch times tended to be rough with fights and physical bullying amongst the boys whereas at the girls' schools they held hands and played together.

In schools which were mixed sex, there was a dividing wall in the playground to separate the boys and the girls. Many children left school at the age of 12, although some did continue to secondary school.



The day was very informative and interesting and particularly relevant to Sociology A Level. Thank you to Ms French for accompanying us.
