Rocket science has come to school as St Bart's is taking part in Tim Peake's space seed Rocket Science experiment.



The rocket seeds and information pack have arrived

Over the next five weeks 13 students in the Year 7/8 science club, assisted by two Year 12 students, will be taking part in a mass national experiment to grow salad leaf rocket seeds. These seeds have been on the space station with Tim Peake for six months and were returned to Earth in March for schools to run their investigations.

The students are all very excited about this opportunity and one aim is to learn about the effects of weightlessness and radiation so that plant varieties can be developed to be grown on long space missions thus providing astronauts with fresh food to enjoy.

The student scientists will be monitoring the seedling growth and recording the data which will be analysed by professional statisticians. This experiment is being coordinated by the Royal Horticultural Society's Campaign for School Gardening and the UK Space Agency.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE SPELLING BEE COMPETITION – YEAR 7

For the third year running our Year 7 students have taken part in the National Foreign Language Spelling Bee competition in either French or German. In the autumn term all students in Year 7 were given a list of 50 words in either French or German and their first challenge was to learn the alphabet in the foreign language and then spell these words out correctly, completing as many as possible in one minute.

At the end of the autumn term, the winners from each tutor group were chosen to go onto the whole school stage and given 50 more words to learn. The whole school part of the competition took place at the end of February, with the students being tested on all 100 words.

The top three students were then selected to represent the school. **Rhiannon Evans 7D2** for French and **Guillermo Aguilar 7P1** and **Alexandra Gould 7E2** for German. With the help of two of our A Level language students, Jocelyn O'Brien 13C2 and Abbie Dixon 13D2, they practised regularly to be ready for the competition.

On Wednesday 20 April they went to the Regional Finals at the University of Brighton, where they competed against other schools from the South East region, this time being tested on a selection from 150 words. They all performed exceptionally well under pressure in front of an audience of other competitors and their teachers. Despite the pressure of performing they all enjoyed the day.

Particular congratulations go to Alexandra Gould 7E2 who gained 2nd position in German and was awarded with a certificate and a medal. She has now earned a



place in the National Final which will take place in July in Cambridge.

Better still, come to the school field and use the equipment there instead.



Mercury Transit – 9 May 2016


- Between 17:30 and 18:30 on 9 May we hope to observe the transit of Mercury across the disk of the Sun
