THE ST BART'S EGYPTIAN GOOSE

As a species native to Africa, it was quite a surprise to see an Egyptian goose enjoying the grass on the school field last week. This bird, more closely related to the shelduck, rather than to other geese, was introduced as an ornamental wildfowl species by wealthy estate owners in the 18th century. It has now escaped into the wild and, due to the mild winters now commonplace in the UK, is breeding successfully in Norfolk and isolated areas around gravel pits in the Thames Valley in Berkshire.



Maybe it was scouting out the trees around our school pond as a possible breeding site. The presence of increasing numbers of non-native invasive species is one potential consequence of our rapidly changing global climate. They are not particularly welcome everywhere, having been designated an agricultural pest in the UK in 2009, but were considered sacred in Ancient Egypt.

WW1 HISTORY TRIP Year 8

On Saturday the 7 May 168 Year 8 students set off from the school at 7:15 in the morning. We were starting our three day World War One History trip to France and Belgium. We arrived at the service station to pick up our tour guide and then we headed to the Channel Tunnel. We arrived at Calais at 1:10pm and then travelled to Ypres. Once we arrived at Ypres we went to Ploegsteert Memorial and the Menin Gate Memorial, where Curnock is commemorated. The Memorials were amazing as they showed how many men died and it was emotional because if it hadn't been for their sacrifice then everything would be different. We attended the Last Post ceremony at Menin Gate where eight St Bart's students laid wreaths for the four Houses of our school. There was amazing music played which reminded us about how sad the war was and how many people died for us. We left there and headed for the château where we would be staying.



The next morning we had breakfast at 7:30 and made our lunch we then left at 8:30. We then travelled to the area of the Somme and visited Thiepval Memorial where Evers is commemorated, we also went to Patterson's grave, Lochnagar crater, which was made by a huge underground explosion and Newfoundland Park. We then went back to the château, had dinner, baked some army biscuits and had free time to relax and go to the games room or play football. The next morning we had breakfast, left the château and went to two cemeteries. One was a German cemetery and the other was Tyne Cot. We also went to Passchendaele Museum where we all walked through some reconstructed trenches.

The trip was an amazing and fascinating adventure and everyone should go next year! The tour guide was very interesting and everyone has learned something new in this trip. Thank you all the teachers who accompanied us on the trip.
