SPORT

Aerobics Club A chance to improve your level of fitness in a different way. Movement to music in a fun and social environment.

Athletics In the summer term, athletics is one of the major sports. We have open athletics practice after school twice a week where students can practise any track or field event in order to improve their personal performance and aim for the school teams which complete in area and national competitions.

Badminton Club An opportunity to come to a club on a Friday after school. Led by an external Badminton coach. Come and have fun with your friends and improve your badminton skills and enter the local area Badminton competitions.

Basketball Open to all girls and boys from all year groups. Come and practise your shooting and lay-ups and then participate in mini and full court games in a fun and relaxed atmosphere.

Cricket Nets This takes place in our first-class cricket facilities. An external coach comes into school and takes cricket nets sessions in the winter in our sports hall. Cricket is one of our main sports in the summer term.

Dodgeball Club Experience the excitement of this fast-moving game. Available for all students.

Girls' Football Club An opportunity for girls to come and participate in the world's most popular sport on a more recreational basis. Have fun socialising with your friends and have the chance to represent the school in cup competitions.

Boys' Football Open to all boys from all year groups. Some football clubs are recreational and a chance to have a good run around and play football for fun. Other football clubs are for our boys' school teams.

Gymnastics Club Open to girls and boys in all year groups. A chance to further explore the fun and exciting side of gymnastics using more advanced apparatus and equipment.

Lacrosse Stick Skills This club is open to all but a must for team players. Come and be part of a famous St Bart's tradition. Develop skills such as passing, running with the ball, tackling and shooting with the opportunity of pulling on the purple colours and representing the school at one of its most successful sports.

DANCE

Beatz Dance Company A female dance company that improves technique and creates innovative choreographies performed in the local area.

Cheerleading Club A cheerleading squad that creates choreographies that are entered into competitions and represent the school at functions and sporting events.

Contrast Contemporary Dance Club A dance club open to all students from all years, with a focus on contemporary dance.

Illusions Dance Company (Years 7,8,9) A great club for dancers from younger years.

KS5 Dance Masterclass Professional artists are invited into St Barts to challenge and teach KS5 students. The style and technique changes each term along with the artist.

Pulse Male Dance Club A choreography club open to all males that improves technique. Innovative choreographies are performed in the local area.

Strut your Stuff Dance Club Jazz dance club open to all students in all years.

Y7 Dance Club A fun and exciting club open to all year 7's that improves basic skills and creates choreographies.

Y8 Dance Club A club that is open to all year 8's that is edgy and creative. This will stretch your skills and improve your technique.

Y9 Dance Club An innovative and forward thinking approach to this club means that you will create choreographies that use contact and contemporary techniques.



DRAMA

Audition Club Thinking about applying to Drama school? Here you can have your monologues directed and rehearsed with the Drama team in preparation for your audition and join the growing list of successful St. Bart's students who have gained places on these highly sought-after courses at prestigious institutions.

House Plays Year 12 and Year 10 are involved in House Plays from September to February. House Plays are directed and produced by Year 12 and Year 10 are the performers (who will be auditioned by Year 12). Plays are sometimes written from scratch; others are well known.

KS3 Dramatic Society Club Brilliant opportunity to join in and have fun with Drama. There are no auditions and we do an end of academic year performance each year in July.

School Play September to December for all year groups. Auditions are held for acting, singing and dancing in September and the Show is performed in early December.

Theatre Technical Club All welcome. Learn about lighting, sound, radio microphones, staging, set, costume and special effects make-up. We have fog, smoke and snow machines, and a host of other gadgets to create the magic of theatre. Learn how to programme the lighting for the show and set radio mics.



MUSIC

Ad Hoc Baroque Orchestra This small group of the school's most able musicians meet on an ad hoc basis to play music of the 17th and 18th centuries (Grade 5+ by invitation).

Big Band Brass and woodwind, with a swinging rhythm section. Emphasis on ensemble performance for more advanced musicians (Grade 5+).

Brass and Percussion Group (Brass Band) For all brass and percussion players, playing brass band music and rehearsing the brass and percussion sections of the SBSO independently.

Concert Band A beginner-friendly ensemble playing fun music. Concert band is open to all (Grade 1+).

Flutti Tutti A flute ensemble for flute players of any ability. All types of music performed, maybe even with just the flute head joint!

Junior Choir Upper voices and lower years. This choir is just for year 7 and 8 students.

Music Technology Club Run by 6th form students, for all students interested in improving their mixing, recording and sequencing skills.

Music Theory Club This group exists to meet the needs of those students currently studying for ABRSM theory exams. Bring your lunch and have a chat.

School Choir Large mixed (male and female voices) choir open to all years and abilities, which prepares for major musical events.

Senior Jazz Combo Wild and unpredictable band of senior musicians in years 10 to 13 for whom anything goes! (Grade 5+ with a focus on improvisation).

Senior Vocal Group Run by 6th form students for 6th form students, this is an acappella group of mixed voices with high standards of singing.

St Bartholomew's School Orchestra (SBSO) All instrumentalists are expected to perform in the school's huge and all-inclusive ensemble, for students of all abilities. The SBSO meets on special orchestra days spread through the year.

String Orchestra For all string players, playing music just for strings, and rehearsing the string section of the SBSO independently.

Ukulele Club A fun student-led ensemble for all ukulele enthusiasts. A supply of school ukuleles in different sizes is available.



OTHER

ASDAN Hair and Beauty (certificated course) Come along and learn about nail services, basic hairdressing techniques and basic facial treatments. Need to be 13+ years.

Art Club for Year 7 Improve your art skills at Activity Time.

Board Games Club Don't be bored at Activity Time, play a board game instead. Identify the murderer, collect properties or make ingenious patterns. If you have a favourite, tell us, and we can play that too.

Carnegie Shadowing Reading Groups In the Summer term, confident readers in Years 7 to 10 can join weekly book groups which read the Carnegie shortlist. School trips and party prizes for those who read the most!

Chess Club Runs every activity time all year-long. A good opportunity to make friends across different years. There are House competitions during the year.

Chinese Club Chinese lessons are open to all students after school on a Thursday. We teach all 4 skills: reading, listening, speaking and writing in Mandarin and also incorporated cultural elements such as a Chinese New Year Party or Mah Jong lessons. There is also a Chinese Exchange with Qingdao No. 2 High School which runs every 2 years. (A small charge is made for these lessons).

Christian Union This lunchtime club is open to Years 7 to 9, whether you believe in God or not! It is led by two youth workers and involves meeting friends, asking big

questions and learning about the Christian faith.

Cineclub Cineclub runs every week for all students. You will plan, write, produce and edit your own short film in a group and the Corn Exchange will show these in the Summer.

Cookery Club Sign up for 6-week courses to improve your skills in the kitchen.

Creative Writing Club Creative Writing Club caters to all students who wish to revel in words, fun and creativity. We cover a number of writing styles on both serious topics and light-hearted escapades. Please come and join in!

Debating Society All years and spectators welcome. A friendly and relaxed club offering the opportunity to argue about current issues and the big questions of life, in a fun atmosphere. You can also take part in competitions e.g. Mock Trials and Debating Matters.

Enterprise Club Fundraise to create your own small businesses in an attempt to turn a profit. Students will have access to a range of projects and speakers and will develop key skills such as teamwork and leadership throughout the year.

Film Club In Film Club we watch and talk about films, old and new, from all genres and from around the world. Join us to experience films you know and ones you don't. You might be surprised. Everyone welcome.

Gardening Club Open to all students, learn horticultural skills by growing plants in our polytunnel and kitchen garden, alongside managing the Nature Reserve.
