#### **AUTHOR VISIT**

On Friday 3 March, in celebration of World Book Day, we were lucky to be visited by popular author, Julia Golding. Julia is a multi-

award winning writer for children and young adults who has published over thirty books in genres ranging from historical adventure to fantasy. Her novels include the Young Knights of the Round Table series, and 'The Diamond of Drury Lane', which won the Waterstones Children's Book Prize and the Nestle Children's Book Prize. She also writes young adult novels as Joss Stirling, including 'Finding Sky', and has written a series of romantic detective novels beginning with 'Struck' which won the Romantic Novel of the Year Award 2015, the first YA book to do so. Over three-quarters of a million of her books have been sold worldwide. She gave two entertaining talks to Year 7, 8 and visiting Year 6 students, on how genres can be 'mashed up' to create new ideas for fiction, using film clip examples such as Dystopia ('1984') plus Reality TV ('I'm a Celebrity') leading to the 'Hunger Games' series. She also involved volunteers from the audience in a 'time travelling' experiment, inviting them to select a hat to create a character and then devise a situation and story for that character by choosing random flash cards. This resulted in some unusual and interesting ideas.

In the afternoon she led two creative writing workshops for Year 7s. In all, it was an entertaining and inspiring day. Many of her books are now available to borrow from the school library.

#### **CAR PARKING**



The school would like to remind parents

about parking at the beginning and end of the school day, as well as following school sports matches. Inconsiderable parking causes obstruction and a risk of accidents.

Drivers are asked not to block neighbouring driveways, only park in the marked disabled bays if entitled to do so and ensure there is a clear thoroughfare through the school driveway to enable other vehicles to enter and exit the site. There are occasions when coaches need access to use the drop off zones at 3.20pm; they are either returning from school trips or departing for PE fixtures and other activities. It is also important to keep the driveway clear should there be a need for emergency access.

Parents dropping off/collecting students are asked to keep road junctions and driveways clear, in particular in Bartlemy Road, Mayfair Drive, Buckingham Road, Wendan Road and Fifth Road (including the area at Brown's Meadow) and not to park on grass verges.

Parents are also asked to keep the entrance to the Sixth Form car park at Wormestall clear and not to block cars parked in the area, to enable student drivers to exit safely.

#### **Sixth Form Car Parking**

Sixth Formers are reminded they may park on the gravel area adjacent to the Wormestall field, entrance from Fifth Road.

They are not permitted to park in the main school car park and are asked to be considerate to neighbours.

Sixth Form drivers must complete a car driving registration form which is on the Sixth Form blog (forms) and in the Sixth Form leaflet dispenser.
