

# STUDENT, PARENT AND STAFF QUESTIONNAIRES

As part of our aim to include feedback from all members of our school community on the strengths of St Bart's and areas for further improvement, students, parents and staff will be asked over the next week to complete questionnaires. As we have done over the last three years, we have worked with a company called Kirkland Rowell, who have a client base of over 2,000 schools throughout the country, to produce these questionnaires and the feedback received will be evaluated against the very large bank of comparative data which the company has. We will also be making comparisons with the results of the 2013 survey in order to evaluate the change which has taken place in the last year.

Students will be completing the questionnaire during the normal full school assembly slot on Wednesday 22 January and parents will receive their questionnaires in envelopes sent home with their children by the end of the same week. We would encourage all parents please to complete the questionnaires, which should take no longer than 15 minutes, and to return these in envelopes with their child by Monday 10 February at the latest. They will then be sent to Kirkland Rowell for collation and analysis. The feedback received will then be used as part of our school improvement planning and a summary of this feedback will be published in BartholoNews.
