NATIONAL CIPHER CHALLENGE

A mathematical national cipher challenge created by Southampton University was entered by two students in 8D1, Bethany Sirianni and Sophia Tucker, and their



achievements were extremely impressive.

Fortnightly coded messages of two parts needed to be deciphered with increasing difficulty over the autumn term and the results were ranked due to their accuracy and speed of response.

Over 1500 teams entered from all over the country from a mixture of schools and colleges. Bethany and Sophia achieved joint 1st in Challenge A and 122nd in Challenge B which placed them overall in the top 10% of entries. Both girls had to use techniques such as Caesar shifts, frequency analysis, affine ciphers and

shifts, frequency analysis, affine ciphers and modular inverses, all of which they had to learn and research themselves. This makes their achievement even more impressive. Congratulations to both students.

Over 110 students are now


part of the '15 Club' with signed certificates to recognise ongoing hard work as we approach GCSE examinations in the summer term.

Students completed the questionnaire during the normal full school assembly slot on Wednesday 18 January and parents will receive their questionnaires in envelopes sent home with their children by the end of this week. They will then be sent to Kirkland Rowell for collation and analysis. The feedback received will then be used as part of our school improvement planning and a summary of this feedback will be published in BartholoNews.

POLO NEWS

Former St Bart's School student Sam Boreham was picked to play in the British Schools and Universities Polo Association (SUPA) polo team playing for the International Intercollegiate Challenge Cup against a team from the United States Polo Association in Phoenix, Arizona on 15 January. The British team pictured right comprised Robin Ormerod (Captain, University of Bristol), Sam Boreham (Nottingham Trent University), Toby Small (RAU Cirencester) and Minnie Kerr-Dineen (University of Nottingham).



The team flew out to Arizona last Thursday, avoiding a baggage handlers' strike and flight cancellations due to snow, and arrived in the early hours of Friday our time. On the same flight was an England team to play a USA team for the Townsend Cup, which took place at the same venue on the previous day.

With two days to acclimatise, do some practice and get to know the differences in the rules (!) the teams lined up. In a very closely fought contest the USA came out on top 15-13, with their last two goals coming in the last minute of the final chukka.

The Most Valuable Player was awarded to well-deserving Robin Ormerod and the USA team's Dalton Woodfin received the Sportsmanship Award. Charles Smith, Chairman of USPA Polo Development, remarked that the horsemanship he witnessed in the game was impressive and commendable.

Sam started playing Polo when at St Bart's, which remains the only non-private school in the country to have a Polo team. In 2007 a St Bart's team made history by becoming the first state school to win a SUPA tournament.
