### FOUR OXBRIDGE OFFERS

Four students from St Bartholomew's School have been offered places at either Oxford or Cambridge University for entry in September 2017.

Conor has a place having achieved three A Levels at the top grade, A\*, last summer. For the others the offers are based on them achieving exceptional standards in their A Level exams, which they will take this summer.

### WELL EQUIPPED STUDENTS READY FOR LEARNING


With effect from Monday 20 February 2017, when we return to school from the half term break, we would like to ensure that every student has the equipment shown in the picture below.
