The team was in a confident mood as the two scorers and older brothers of the 1<sup>st</sup> XI captain and wicket keeper raised the school flag at Falkland Cricket Club in the weather described as Wimbledon in the scorebook. A big thank you to both **Tom Herrington** for his electronic scoring/statistics/photography and **Adam Osmond** for his geography skills with the traditional scorebook.

The MCC Captain Sal Butt soon regretted his decision put Bart's in the field as Captain **Will Herrington** unleashed his opening bowlers of **Callum Johnson** and **Sharif Admadzai**. **Callum** bowled a maiden first over and **Sharif** not to outdone went one better with a maiden wicket over. **Cameron Flack** as it turned out was just as competitive and matched his maiden wicket in his first over decimating the MCC batsman wicket in similar fashion as **Sharif**, before he repeated the feat in his fourth over after a good catch by **Luke Gregory** at cover. The team was excellent in the field throughout the innings and when **Joe Eva** was bowling **Ali Uwins's** relaxed direct

hit saw off the fourth MCC batsman with only 53 runs on the board after 20 overs. Inspirational skipper **Herrington** certainly knew how to get the best out of his bowlers as **Luke Gregory** bowled a great first over and very nearly got out the backing up batsman with his fast reaction fielding deflecting into the stumps. **Luke** was able to follow in **Sharif** and **Cameron's** footsteps and he also with his last bowl took a wicket as keeper **Danny Osmond** ensured his first over was a maiden wicket over. **Flack** was rewarded with a third wicket and held the best bowling figures for the school with 3 wickets for 19 runs from 7 overs. **Herrington** then took charge of the ball himself and in his first over very nearly claimed a wicket but the MCC batsman's pull shot was hit harder than **Sharif** could deal with despite his best efforts. Lunch beckoned and the school further turned the screw as **Herrington** claimed two more wickets, one caught behind for a wicket maiden (almost a double wicket maiden) and the other clean bowled. The MSS were very unaccustomed to facing a school side with such a commanding bowling attack and looked shell shocked with 8 down going in for lunch and with just 95 on the score board.

The MCC still however had their trump card up to bat in **Rajosh Rao** who was confident with his 73 first class games for Middlesex and Sussex that he could make life difficult for the school. Even **Callum Johnson** who opens the bowling for Thatcham 1<sup>st</sup> XI Cricket Club saw his pace bowling being guided to the boundary if there was any hint of an imperfect delivery. The school kept its composure and **Osmond** nearly claimed Rao's wicket on two occasions before **Gregory** at cover once again took a good catch to make his skipper a very happy bowler. **Johnson** finally got what he deserved and claimed the final wicket and was quick to get into his batting pads after the application of plasters and debate if the traditional school white blazer would be more suitable than his brand new school shirt.



Unfortunately for **Johnson** he felt the fight back from the proud MCC players as Paul Douglas whose wicket he had taken struck back after four overs. **Oli Sopp** was a similar victim and it was up to opener **Luke Gregory** (pictured left) to retain his wicket and stay in for the long haul as the school had lots of time and overs to chase

the 140 runs. **Luke** had the best batting figures for the school staying at the crease for 105 minutes and scoring 26 runs before being trapped LBW by the very impressive **Ian Boyton** who was not happy with being bowled out for a duck as the MCC opening batsman. It took him until his 12<sup>th</sup> over to have more runs than wickets against his figures which finished as 3 wickets for 9 runs, 8 maidens from 13

overs! **Will Herrington** (pictured right) batted for just over an hour and had the best



strike rate in the match hitting 27 runs off 28 balls before being bowled by Boyton. **Sharif Admadzia** and **Matt Nichols** both remained on strike but had a difficult time finding many bad balls to strike, although **Sharif** did stroke three beautiful boundaries. The match then swung towards the MCC as **Harry Houlder** claimed three wickets including a caught and bowled **C Flack**. **Will Barnes** was in form for his club having reached the half century mark and looked to be transferring that form into the match with a 3 boundaries included in his 20 runs. **Barnes** also looked good between the wickets with two three in his tally but was eventually undone by a narrow run out. **Ali Uwins**, the hero in our fixture against the ONA was called on again to accumulate key runs in a nail biting 45 minute innings. He was very well supported by a nerveless but tired and emotional **Joe Eva** whose text book

forward defence was called into action. It was however just a matter of time and **Joe** picked three bad balls, each dispatched for four runs to see the school claim a well deserved historic win with 12 overs in hand but only one wicket.
