On Thursday 26 September Dr Alonzi and three A2 chemistry students, Sophie Smith, Kim Fletcher-Bott and Laura Brennan, went to the Department of Chemistry at the University of Reading for an enlightening day about careers that are an Alternative To Medicine (AToM).

The students started the day with a talk on some of the possible degree courses they could pursue with a background in science A Levels. They then attended a series of hands on workshops in Pharmacy, Forensics and Genetics. Lunchtime was spent talking to a variety of people from different careers, including PhD students, food scientists, water scientists and a research scientist from Proctor and Gamble.

The day was very informative and highlighted many of the options available to students wishing to continue studying science. The students thoroughly enjoyed the day and said they felt it really opened their eyes into the large range of possible science careers. St Bart's chemistry department hope to be offering the same trip next year.

YEAR 12 CHAMPIONS OF ENTERPRISE

To kick off the autumn term another successful Champions of Enterprise took

place on 26 September for the whole of Year 12. With 46 teams working in both the Hall and Sixth Form area, the day was buzzing with activity as they took on the challenges presented to them.

Run by the Education Business Partnership West Berkshire, Champions of Enterprise is a 'dragons den' style of event in which teams of Year 12 students assume the role of corporate investor. Their task: to analyse three real local businesses, **Celbase**, a company specialising in original artwork from cartoon series of the 70s, 80s and 90s, **Environmental Solutions** offering collection and recycling services and **Hartwood Oak** who build bespoke buildings in oak. Each team then has to decide which of the three companies has the greatest potential for development by researching their strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT analysis). The day culminates in teams presenting their research and investment decision to a panel of judges.

As a school we have been involved in Champions of Enterprise for many years. The life skills it provides our students helps to prepare them for both life in the Sixth Form and beyond. By running the event at the start of Year 12, students have the opportunity to work with fellow students they haven't worked with or perhaps even met before; they practice skills of problem solving, research and analysis, working to deadlines and teamwork, all of which are attributes every employer will be looking for. Business volunteers from local companies also come in to school for the day to provide invaluable support and guidance to our students as well as acting as judges during the afternoon of presentations; we give them our thanks and appreciation for their time and enthusiasm.

All teams worked hard at the tasks they were given but at the end of the day only six teams would go forward to Day 2 and tackle a further challenge.



Everyone is to be commended for their contributions and in particular the ultimate winning team from 12C2 pictured above (left to right Harriet Wilson, Megan Bone, Katherine Valentine, Chelsea Ford, Rachel Barnes, Yasmin Copas). They will now be preparing for the regional final on 4 December at Arlington Arts where they will compete against winning teams from other local schools. We wish them every success!

CAREERS

Well done to all of the Year 11-13 students who attended the **Spotlight on performing Arts, Media and Film Careers**. This event was the first of a series of “Spotlight” sessions this academic year to give students an insight into a variety of different career sectors. Our students were given the opportunity to have an interactive day to help support their career and employment decisions.

Students chose three workshops they wished to attend after an introduction from all the professionals. The workshops allowed students to ask questions first hand to professionals and also carry out small group activities to help consider aspects of the job. Tom Beck from the British Institute of Music led a live interview with upcoming band Glass City Vice and then challenged the group to discuss how to manage/promote them. It was very eye opening to see how much importance bands had to place on their online image, with the band even considering developing their name based on how easy it would be found on a Google search.

They also highlighted how difficult the profession was to get a break in and gave examples of the knock backs and patience bands/individuals needed. They gave examples of the Elbow who had released 8 to 10 albums before they were recognised and Biffy Clyro who were gigging for nearly 18 years before they discovered success.

In another workshop actor/dancer George Olney gave a very honest account about career pathways in his field and put the groups under pressure to deal with a mock audition. He dealt with how you could get support with grants to attend music or drama school, the costs of attending, some excellent tips for auditions and networking.

This pattern was followed by; Greg Rudman from Atlantis Media, who not only dealt with Film/Media production but also Social media, how to get a job as a “runner” and developing a portfolio. Ian Hickling from Transplan Radio who covered all areas relating to transmission planning/broadcasting and even offered all participates to be live on radio within the month. Chris Billingham (ex St Bart’s student) from Maxx Design gave a great insight into web design and the huge influence social media can have. He delivered a bespoke session for all those who attended and also dealt with Twitter and blogs. Sarah Gregson and Kerrie Walker from the Corn Exchange dealt with all aspects relating to a theatre and acting as a provider for Performing Arts.

Heidi Bird gave a contrasting viewpoint from the Watermill theatre on differing roles are involved in a theatre which produces performances. Winchester University outlined for pupils an overview of Performing Arts courses and gave a flavour of what it is like to study at degree level.

The event was closed with a career fair, allowing students to mingle, visit a stands and also have time to ask the speakers informal questions.

ST BART'S MAKE NATIONAL CRICKET FINAL

In BartholoNews on 24 September the success of the Y8 2012-2013 cricket team was mentioned. A full report follows.

Following some exciting local and regional qualifying rounds, St Bart's Year 8 cricketers reached the final stages of the 'Chance to Shine' cricket competition. This involved over 400 schools throughout the country and culminated in the top four schools competing for the title at Northampton County Cricket ground on Friday 13 September.

The semi-final and final matches were due to be played on Northamptonshire's outdoor square but unfortunately poor weather meant that all the games were switched to the indoor school.

In a thrilling semi-final St Bart's, representing the South of England, made a score of 48 off their seven overs against Corby Business Academy, representing the Midlands. With one over to go Corby needed 4 runs to win, but in an extraordinary finale and with captain James Bird bowling, five wickets fell giving St. Bart's the victory on the last ball with a superb run-out.

In the final St Bart's met London and the East qualifiers, Altrincham Grammar School who posted the highest score of the day with 68 runs. St Bart's were never quite up with the asking rate and despite a valiant effort they finished 14 runs short on 54 and were therefore runners-up in the competition.

The whole day was a great experience for all the boys in the squad and was greatly enjoyed by the boys and travelling parents alike. This can only serve to be a great springboard for this talented team as they meet fresh challenges in the years ahead.

They scored another try only for Cameron Barr to finish well again supported by big carries from Barney Serruya, George Osborne, Rhys Thomas, Sam Eva and Evan Calvert. Ollie Harris and Fin Roy were particularly impressive at the break down for St Bart's matching the home team body positions and urgency.

The second half saw their fly half have to leave the field after a heavy tackle by C Barr but his replacement was, according to their coach, of equal or better standard and so it turned out to be as the home team crossed scored again. The game seemed to be pulling away from St Bart's as Abingdon scored a try from the resulting restart as their impressive wing was given too much time and space. St Bart's however demonstrated excellent character, raising our game in the final 15 minutes which saw Rhys Thomas create all sorts of issues for the home team with a combination of his pace, footwork and exceptional power enabling him to score.

Cameron Barr the man of the Match (pictured left) crossed for



his third try and Abingdon had to dig very deep to stop the green and white barrage at their line and it was with great relief that they kicked the ball off the pitch for the final whistle.

1st XV v Berkshire College Of Agriculture Won 43 - 0

The first team went in to their second round match in the newly named Nat West National Cup with confidence after a comprehensive win against St John's last Wednesday. The team continued the undefeated start to the season with another dominant performance against BCA. The pack gave the backs some great first phase possession as both the scrum and line out improved from previous performances. The urgency and line speed in defence also gave BCA little time to find a foothole in the game with Ed Porter, Scott Cullen and Lewis Rogers all particularly impressive. The quality of our backs told and it was great that all the back three scored tries in the first half as first O Cooper, then B Rees and lastly O Sedgwick all scored before half time.

Barr scored another try but touched down two other times only for the last pass to be deemed forward. Captain A Price-Richards added to the tally with a show and go to power over for our final try. The man of the match award had numerous contenders as Ed Porter was excellent throughout with his work rate and defence, Lewis Rogers for a huge tackle and for his sacking in the line out, Ashley Beaver for his carrying and adding to a solid scrum, Oli Cooper & Cameron Barr for their counter attacking and finishing, Angus Clements for controlling our exit strategy and distribution. Ultimately however the award went to Scott

Cullen for his work rate, never taking a backward step and that try which any winger would have been very proud to claim. The next home game is in the third round of the Nat West National Cup v Marlborough College 2.30 KO support very welcome.
