HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

We have had an excellent first half term and we hope that this second half will be as successful as we move towards the

external examination period for many of our students.

May I also thank you for all the feedback I have had from everyone in recent weeks which is helping us plan positive changes to move the school forward. One change we are about to introduce is a refinement to the school's behavioural system to ensure all students can achieve in an outstanding learning environment at all times. As I have told students in assembly, one minor disruption of one minute in a lesson leads to 25 minutes of learning lost as all 25 students in the class have lost a minute; students need to ensure they are focussed all the time.

A consequence of the change is that if a student finds it difficult to settle, the member of staff may ask the student to return at the end of school on the same day for 10 – 15 minutes to discuss how they can improve and work together next lesson to maintain good relationships and overcome any barriers they have. This will be instead of a detention, which is more effective in aiding learning. If this could be a problem for your child staying after 3.30pm please inform your child's House office.

Planned Industrial Action

As you may be aware, industrial action is planned by one of the main teaching unions, the National Union of Teachers, on Wednesday 26 March. As always, we will have to consider the levels of staffing we anticipate to be in school on that day to see how we will operate. The duty of care of students' safety and well being is a paramount consideration. We will inform you of the final arrangements the school will make as soon as possible, but I can confirm that the Year 12 Higher Education Convention will be going ahead and the examination years of Year 11 and Year 13, as well as Year 7 students, will all be expected to be in school.


