Lastly, we are sadly saying goodbye to several members of staff at the end of term. More than 75 years of teaching have been notched up by Mr Grant, Mrs Nichol and Mrs Pollitt.



Mr Grant joined St Bart's in 1980 as a music teacher and was promoted to Head of Expressive Arts in 2006. He has greatly contributed to the multitude of opportunities students have to get involved in concerts, House competitions and performances.

Mrs Nichol is retiring after 14 years as Head of English. She has seen the Faculty develop and grow in both size and success. Exam results have improved year on year and new subjects in Media and Film Studies have been introduced under her leadership.

Mrs Pollitt has been associated with St Bart's for 54 years as she joined Newbury Girls' Grammar School as a student from 1961 to 1968. She returned to the old girls school from 1972 to 1975 to teach History before taking a break when her children were young. In 1991 she was again appointed as a history teacher and has remained since. Mrs Pollitt has a particular interest in the history of the school and we have been privileged to read two publications she has written - 'Wisdom is strength: a history of Newbury Girls' School' marked its centenary in 2004 and then in 2010

'Ad Lucem' was published which reflects on the history of both former grammar schools and subsequent changes to education at St Bart's, concluding with the school's move into our new buildings in 2010.

Also retiring are Mr Winkle and Mr Arthur. We wish them all well for the future.

## COUNTY MEDAL WINNER



Jamie Kuehnel 12P3 won the silver medal in the senior boys' hammer at the English Schools' Track and Field Championships in Gateshead (pictured left). His best throw of 59.13m was a personal best by over a metre and a new club U20 record. He only just missed out on gold.
