CHINESE EXCHANGE 2015

The first leg of this year's Chinese exchange took place just before and during October half term. The students, accompanied by Mrs Tang and myself, spent three days in Beijing followed by a week with our partner school in Qingdao - Qingdao no 2 Middle School. The weather



was clear and sunny for most of our time in China - with temperatures as high as 24 degrees in Qingdao. During our stay in Beijing, we visited the Great Wall, the Forbidden City, the Temple of Heaven, Tiananmen Square and enjoyed an acrobatics show and in Qingdao students had the chance to sit in on lessons with their partners as well as taking part in specially provided sessions on calligraphy, dance and mask painting. In addition, we went out and about sightseeing in and around Qingdao, which is a beautiful coastal city between the sea and the holy mountain of Lao Shan. By the time we returned, students were expert in their use of chopsticks, and many had taken the opportunity to practise their Mandarin and learn new words and phrases whilst with their partners, their friends and families.



Below are some reflections on the trip by students:

"The Chinese Exchange was incredible. I have learned so much about the Chinese culture and how different it is to Britain. The school was completely different to ours - they had many more facilities such as high ropes and even a climbing wall. Also they had mini study bars and a cafe! I think St Bart's should invest in

one. I learnt many useful phrases, the most useful was probably "chi bao le" - this means "I'm full!"

"Whilst I was staying with my host family I ate octopus dumplings. They were slightly chewy and rubbery but they actually tasted alright. The highlight of lessons for my

exchange partner, Han Rong, is the weekly karaoke competition which I witnessed on my first day at the school."

"The Chinese Exchange was amazing! The school was incredible! All of the students work so hard and spend all of their spare time doing homework. Qingdao was such a beautiful place and I'd love to go back there some day!"



"I loved the China Exchange trip. I learned so much about how the Chinese live and met so many friendly people. I loved the cafe on top of the school (something we should get) and the fun-sounding bell which sounded through the school about a million times. I loved staying with my exchange partner and her family and I learned about the Chinese way of ordinary life and I loved trying all their different food traditions."

"We were in Beijing for three days. We saw the Great Wall, Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City, it was all wonderful. I tried a lot of new food, most of which I liked. The duck was so good I felt like I'd died and gone to heaven."

"China was amazing. First of all we flew to China. It took nine hours! We flew with Air China, 777-300ER - it was massive. The next day we climbed the Great Wall. I wanted to give up, but I didn't because it is a once in a lifetime experience."



"The China Exchange was a great trip and a fun learning opportunity about Chinese culture and daily life in China. Beijing was a way to be introduced to the architecture, madness and culture of China whilst Qingdao gave an insight into daily life and the school day. The food I expected to be one of the highlights of the trip and it was. Overall the trip is extremely valuable and I recommend it."

"My trip to China is an experience that I will never forget. It is so culturally and socially different to England. I really enjoyed my time in both Beijing and Qingdao, but in different ways. I loved how inviting and welcoming all the students were at Qingdao no 2 middle School and my time in Beijing was great with all the famous sightseeing that we did."

"My favourite part was going to Qingdao no 2 Middle School. The students were all so happy to have us there and they made us feel welcome. Living with someone else helped me to understand a different lifestyle and to try

new things. Looking back on the whole thing I would do it all over again. I've made new friends that I will definitely keep in touch with."



"The Beijing-Qingdao Exchange is an eye-opening and unforgettable experience, especially for those who are studying Mandarin. Being immersed in the Chinese culture via a family and Qingdao no 2 High School allows you to become part of the culture and also improve your speaking (in Mandarin)! The conjunction of both understanding real life in China and gaining knowledge of China's wealth of history creates a well-balanced and impressive trip which certainly promotes social acceptance and growth in an individual."

The focus is on keeping your children safe on line.



ORCHESTRA DAY

Last Wednesday more than 100 students participated in the school orchestra's all day rehearsal. We began the day with a quick warm-up and went on to look at the first of our three new pieces called Finale from the Firebird by Stravinsky. This was conducted by Mrs Robertson who encouraged us to imagine that a giant golden bird was swooping around the hall whilst we played.



Next we played Habanera from Carmen by Georges Bizet conducted by Miss Boggett where we learnt that the piece was about attraction and how best to play in order to express that.

Our final piece was Symphony No 10, 2nd Movement by Shostakovich conducted by Mr Maunders. This spread across five pages for many instruments, but the whole symphony is over 45 minutes long. The length and some complicated rhythms definitely kept us on our toes.

After these run-throughs we split into sections and rehearsed until our parts were almost perfect, under the expert guidance of Sixth Form musicians James Murrell, David Goldberg and Tom Carr.

Close to the end of the day we reunited to hear the amazing results of our hard work which we hope to be able to share with you at a future concert.

All the musicians would like to thank the music department and the student leaders for an enjoyable and rewarding day.
