

## TWO NEW GARDENS CREATED

The Horticulture Team in Year 11 has revamped the two gardens that lie between the Davis and Evers blocks. The task involved a great deal of digging to remove the woody plants and weeds, laying of weed membrane, cementing in a course of bricks to edge the gardens and finally to add a layer of decorative bark over the top.



We are very grateful for the generous support given by the Parents' Association to enable this project to go ahead, and the time given by staff to help with the digging. One of the beds (pictured left) is being planted as an edible garden. There are already a set of everyday herbs,

which are routinely used by the Food Technology Department. These will shortly be joined by figs, mulberries and walnuts. The final stage will include some more unusual varieties such as the Blue Sausage Tree!

The other bed (right) is being planted up as a classification garden to showcase the different types of plants and provide an educational resource for students.

## YOUR SCHOOL NEEDS YOU! – Parent Governor Vacancies

Notice of the Parent Governor Election was sent out on Friday. As a reminder, the Governing Body of St Bartholomew's School are inviting nominations to fill three Parent Governor vacancies.

Should you wish to stand for election, please return your nomination form by midday on Friday 29 April 2016.

Broadly, the role of the Governing Board is to set the strategic direction and ensure the educational performance, management and financial health of St Bart's. Individual governors are members of the Governing Board and contribute to ensure high standards of achievement for all. As St Bart's is an academy trust, the governors are also directors and trustees and are subject to company and charity law.

New governors can be confident of joining a friendly, supportive and professional team. We were inspected by Ofsted last year and the inspectors commented that 'Governors give a strong lead to the direction of the school and provide a good balance of challenge and support. They are fully involved in the life of the school and ensure that the skills of all governors are used fully in checking the quality of all aspects of the school's work'.

That's not to say that we're complacent, however, and we have a clear plan to further improve our own contribution. In addition to the fresh perspectives that new governors bring, the Governing Board has identified that there is a need for skills and expertise in the areas of human resource management, digital and finance. As a result we would be particularly delighted to hear from applicants who can bring any of these qualities.

The time commitment is very reasonable: individual governors normally attend at least

three evening meetings a term. Governors may be members of more than one committee and will also usually have a "link" role with a particular faculty or function which will require a little time during the day. Very occasionally there are some additional activities that are scheduled during the day so some flexibility would be an advantage. Governors are also encouraged to support the celebrations of achievement, such as Key Stage evenings, and performances such as House Music, Dance and Plays.

Successful candidates will be given every support to become quickly integrated and effective via a tailored induction plan and will benefit from ongoing training. The role is unpaid though a governor expenses scheme is in place.

Anyone who has parental responsibility for a student currently attending St Bart's is eligible to stand for election, subject to the clauses detailed in the Governors' Declaration which can be found on the Governors' page of the website. Terms of office are for four years; governors may continue to serve the remainder of their term once their child leaves the School.
