HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE



Firstly, can I thank everyone who responded to the Ofsted questionnaires this week. The inspection team were impressed with the large response and very appreciative of it, as were we. Overall, we were proud of everyone's efforts and we expect the outcome of the inspection at the beginning of May.

This term we have celebrated our success in winning the Active Secondary School Award in the Get Berkshire Active Awards for the second year running. This recognises all the activities available to our students and their participation in them, which is tremendous. We were also delighted to get recognition for the excellent performance of our students at A level, which has been within the top 25% nationally over the last three years by ALPS, a national organisation which looks at the performance of 2,980 schools and colleges.

There have been many highlights this term, although over the last few weeks, in addition to our Ofsted inspection, the snow brought additional challenges for a couple of days, but it was good to see the students enjoying the snow in school. Thank you to everyone for your understanding during this period.

Last week, it was great to see our students and staff join together in our activities to raise money for Sport Relief, and I personally enjoyed running the mile with Year 7 and those who were more adventurous and did it as a three-legged challenge. It has also been pleasing to see so many students involved in many activities across the school this term. Many of those have featured in BartholoNews

and assemblies this term, including Science Week, when we all witnessed science demonstrations in the Hub, BBC School Report Day, Young Enterprise, the school production, 'Beauty and the Beast' and House Debating and House Drama which takes place tonight. It always makes me so proud to see the exceptional talent and achievements of our students that contribute to the great school we are.

This term, students' final applications to universities have been made and they have now received many offers. This has been an exceptionally successful year for our students, with 10 students gaining Oxbridge and Medical university offers. We have also offered 270 places to Year 6 students to join us in September, and visits to primary schools to meet them and support their transition are already underway. We look forward to welcoming them to St Bart's.

As we move towards the main external examination season, may I ask that you encourage students in examination groups to make use of the Easter period to focus on their revision and attend the Easter revision sessions that we have put on, as appropriate, to ensure that they will achieve their true potential in the forthcoming examinations.

Lastly, can I thank everyone who also returned their Kirkland Rowell survey to us, from which we will now use the findings, along with those from Ofsted, to further improve the school.

I wish everyone a happy and restful Easter break and I look forward to seeing everyone back and ready for a successful and productive summer term.

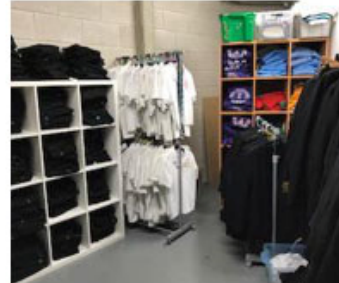
