## HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE



Firstly, as the term comes to an end and World Cup football fever dies down, may I thank everyone for their support, hard work and involvement throughout this year. It has been another successful and busy year in which we received a short inspection from Ofsted. We were really pleased that the inspection team recognised the many strengths of the school and we are very proud of the report. It was excellent to see the hard work of the students and staff recognised and the fact that St Bart's has continued to improve to now potentially being outstanding. Most recently it has also been pleasing to receive the Artsmark Gold Award from the Arts Council England. This recognises the school's commitment to the value of the arts and the excellent range on offer in the arts in school, which they said was very impressive. Then, of course, in February for the second successive year we won the Active Secondary School Award again at the Get Berkshire Active Awards Evening, which also recognised the wealth of opportunities in the school.

As I am sure you have noticed, we are pleased that the extension to Wormestall building to allow for greater Sixth Form study facilities, has now commenced and is due to be completed by the end of October.

The end of term has ended with some enjoyable events: Founder's Day, Sports Day, House Dance, Years 7-9 Celebration and

Curriculum Days. And today we are celebrating the centenary of our Houses: Curnock, Davis, Evers and Patterson, and I am confident that your sons and daughters will come home at the end of school today talking about all the special activities we have put on to mark this significant milestone in our history.

In September there are a few changes in the Leadership Team as the school continues to grow in strength, and Mr Cook, Assistant Headteacher: Learning & Achievement at KS3 & KS4, has stepped down after 16 years in this role. ### **FEEDBACK FROM ANNUAL PARENTAL SURVEY**

We would like to thank all the parents who responded to our annual parental survey in the Spring term. We had 324 responses returned to school which were sent to Kirkland Rowell to be processed. We apologise that it has taken until the end of the school year to be able provide parents and carers with the feedback from the survey, which was partly caused by a difficulty with getting sight of the additional written comments which many parents added. These have now all been read, however, so we can provide feedback from both the quantitative data which the survey provided, and also from the qualitative comments received.

The main headline is that we are delighted to report incredibly positive responses from the survey. Against criteria compared to other schools in the two previous years, your responses produced an 'overall performance score' of 83%, which is well into the top 'excellent' category.

Whilst the majority of responses said the school had stayed about the same over the last year, 26% said the school had improved further, with only 5% saying it had declined. Again, most parents of students in Years 7 & 8 said the school had lived up to their expectations.

Responses gave excellent scores to the school's facilities, exam results, choice of subjects and extra-curricular clubs. An extremely high score was also given to the Show My Homework system, and whilst some parental comments continue to raise issues here with consistency in the use of the system, we are delighted that it has now been fully embedded into our way of working and that all stakeholders across the school have given it very high approval ratings. We will continue to work on full consistency and we will also be using SMHW as part of our KS3 rewards system from September.

Whilst the responses indicated that there are no areas of the school which fall below the Kirkland Rowell benchmark of 'good' there are clear priorities. The top two priorities for improvement which came out of the quantitative responses are teaching quality and school discipline. This is completely in line with other schools who Kirkland Rowell work with and are absolutely the areas of day-to-day focus for us. We are delighted, for instance, to see a significant rise in the overall ranking responses gave to teaching quality in this year's survey.

From the written comments which have been fed back to us, a key area you would like to see us focus on is in improving communication between school and home and providing parents with information about their own child's progress. A number of comments were received regarding the scheduling of the Year 7 parents evening late in the year for instance. We are of course aware of the transition from a primary school system, where parents are in frequent contact with one class teacher, and a secondary system where a range of teachers are involved across the curriculum and day-to-day contact is inevitably less possible. The parents' information evening for Year 7 in September

and the 'settling-in' evening in October when parents can meet their child's tutor is an attempt to ease this transition. The timing of the parents' evening in May is designed to provide feedback when teachers across all subjects (some of which are only taught in one hour a week) have done enough detailed assessment of all students to be fully diagnostic in their comments. We will, however, continue to evaluate the timing of parents' evenings for all year groups in the school.

Another aspect of communication about student progress which attracted comments is our reporting system. We have adjusted this in recent years to focus on indicators which allow parents to see the progress that students are making across all their subjects. We no longer include written comments as we are instead asking teachers to focus their diagnostic comments and support for improvement within their feedback on students' work and assessments. Again, there is a balance to be struck here, but we would like to encourage all parents across the school to make full use of their access to their child's books as the main source of detailed feedback on progress and how to improve. This can have the advantage of not only giving parents the information they are seeking, but also of allowing them to reinforce to students what they should be focusing on in order to make really good progress in their learning.

As a result of the detailed feedback from the parental survey, alongside that received from the student and staff surveys, a number of things have been placed into the school development plan for the next academic year. As well as influencing our constant focus on teaching and learning and positive behaviour, we have included a specific action in the plan to review parental communication and we will be asking for parents' thoughts on this during the Autumn term.


