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CHARLIE WALKS 20 MILES FOR CURNOCK CHARITY CANCER CARE

Year 7 student, Charlie Fox, has raised a staggering £1710 for Newbury Cancer Care, his House charity by walking to Hungerford and back.



Former Curnock House Head, Mike Hart, (pictured with Charlie and current House Head, Mr Sutherland) gave an assembly at the start of term, encouraging students to

raise money for Curnock's chosen charity which assists local people facing cancer diagnoses. Charlie decided he would do his bit by walking 20 miles and asking for sponsorship.

The walk took place last Sunday. Charlie set off from home, with his mother and cocker spaniel Bertie before 9am, arriving in Hungerford in time for lunch. They set off on the return journey to Newbury at 1pm and, determined to see the Christmas lights switched on in Newbury at 5pm, they somehow found the energy to run for the last 10 minutes!

Charlie's Just Giving page has received £855 worth of sponsorship and his mother, who works for Vodafone, will be able to get match funding for the pledges.

His efforts have made Charlie quite a local celebrity with a piece in the Newbury Weekly News and a radio interview planned on Wednesday this week, on Kennet Radio's drive time programme.

Mr Hart, who issued the challenge to students, said *"Well done Charlie, you are a Curnock Hero. You really stepped up to the mark with this walk, raising so much money in the process. A fantastic effort! Congratulations Charlie!"*



Charlie, who remained upbeat and excited all day, was thrilled to have outdone his own personal best step count, with over 56,000 steps racked up over the course of the day. Despite being tired and suffering sore legs, inspirational Charlie arrived back in School on Monday morning with a smile on his face, ready for Dance rehearsals! Well done Charlie on this fantastic achievement.

GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK

On Tuesday 12 November a group of Year 9 Geography students carried out some physical geography fieldwork within the school grounds.

The aim of the fieldwork was to compare infiltration rates between four different sites; in the nature reserve under trees and in long grass, on the field and on the hard standing.

The class were divided into groups with each group given the equipment they needed. At each site the infiltration tube was pushed into the ground and 15cm of water added. A stopwatch was then started and after 30 seconds students wrote down the water level. They continued this for 5 minutes in total. This whole process was then repeated at the other

three sites. Back in the classroom the results were discussed and the method evaluated.

Unsurprisingly the water did not infiltrate into



the hard standing area, however it did infiltrate the fastest in an area under the trees in the nature reserve. The class were asked to write up the fieldwork for Independent Study. All

students agreed that it was interesting and fun to take the learning outside and have a go at some geography fieldwork.

BUSINESS STUDIES AND COMPUTING STUDENTS VISIT BMW

Students of A Level and L3 BTEC Business Studies and Computing visited the BMW Mini plant in Oxford.

Students started their trip with a visit to the exhibition centre which covers the history of the BMW Mini brand, along with detail about operations and marketing at the business.



Students then had a tour of the manufacturing facility, starting with the production and welding of the frame and chassis. This was followed by the post paint phase where the cars are assembled with engines and wheels

etc added. Finally, we were able to see the finished cars being driven off the production line. Students saw different aspects of operations such as cell production and Just-in-Time inventory management and appreciate the importance of computer control of these various operations.
