SIXTH FORM LEADERSHIP EXPANSION

We are really pleased that our vibrant successful Sixth Form continues to be popular and grows in numbers, providing post 16 education for students from St Bart's and beyond.

To ensure we maintain the excellent provision to all students we have made the decision to extend the leadership structure within the Sixth Form which has grown by one third over the last four years. Therefore we are now appointing a Head of Sixth Form to work under the leadership of Mr Adam Robbins who, as Assistant Headteacher, will remain responsible for the continued strategic direction and growth of the Sixth Form.

Currently we are arranging interviews for students who have applied to the Sixth Form for next year and these are taking place on 25 & 27 February and 2 & 4 March. Y11 students have already been contacted about the arrangements for this.

Following the expansion of the Sixth Form accommodation and study area two years ago we are now very excited by this opportunity to strengthen the Sixth Form team and we look forward to welcoming all the new students in September 2020.




