#### **UNIFORM MATTERS - Y7-11**

Last week we wrote to parents and carers to reiterate the high standards for uniform. The key points are below:

- The school blazer must be worn. It is not an optional item of clothing. The black school jumper is an
  item that can be worn with the blazer, when it is cold, but not instead of the blazer. Hoodies are not
  allowed.
- Students must wear black shoes. Black trainers are **not** allowed. I am aware that some retailers are selling black trainers as 'Back to School' shoes, but these are not in our St Bart's uniform policy.
- Students should not wear jewellery, except for a single stud earing in each ear, and facial piercings are also not allowed. Students cannot wear nail varnish, fake nails or eyelashes.

We will continue to challenge students who choose to wear the uniform incorrectly and there will be sanctions for not wearing the correct uniform. If there are financial issues with rectifying uniform issues with your child, please contact your child's tutor or House Office, so that we might support you with this. There can be occasions when your child might need to wear non-uniform items (lost items, injuries, unusual circumstances). In these circumstances, please provide your child with a note so we can arrange for them to have a temporary uniform pass.
