DAVIS WIN INAUGURAL HOUSE FILM

An unsolved murder at the fair, gangsters at an arcade and ghosts at a school sleepover; these are just some of the delights that St Bart's students had in store for the sell-out crowd at the inaugural House Film on Thursday night.

Since September, over eighty students have been involved in this new House competition, taking on a variety of roles including writing scripts, acting, camerawork, lighting, sound, costume, hair and make-up...some even built a set! The end result was eight short films, two for each house, with Year 10 (and in one case, Year 11) students acting as House Film



Captains, working with students from Years 7-9 (Junior category) and Year 13 students leading a team of Year 12s and 11s (Senior category).

Students, parents and teachers gathered to watch the premiere of the films, with the filmmakers walking a red carpet on arrival and everyone tucking into popcorn. Headteacher, Dr Fitter, kicked off the evening with a welcome speech that noted the incredible efforts the students had gone to.



A series of coursework pieces from Year 13 Media Studies students were shown 'out of competition' to whet the audience's appetite before the Junior and Senior films were screened to a raptourous reception. The films were judged by Omar Soomro, a former St Bartholomew's student, who has gone on to do camerawork on productions for Netflix and Disney, and Adam Kotz, an actor with major TV and film credits, whose children used to attend the school.

Amid great tension and , the runners-up and winners were announced with Davis' dark portrayal of a nightmare taking second place in the Junior competition and Patterson's 'The Shining'-inspired sleepover gone wrong, taking the trophy. In the Senior competition, the judges praised the artistic vision of the Evers entry and awarded it runner-up but Davis took the win with their murder mystery film: 'Murder in a House of Mirrors'. The combination of second and first place was enough to mean Davis were crowned the first ever House Film champions.

Head of Social Sciences Faculty, Mr Castel, said: "glamour, excitement, talent and a slightly terrifying insight into the teenage psyche, it had it all."



Head of the Film and Media department, Mr Evans said: "What an incredible evening! We are so proud of our students, who have put so much time and effort into this. The talent on show is unbelievable!"

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CHANGES TO SCHOOL UNIFORM AND PE KIT

Last year we undertook a uniform review which focused on our four guiding principles of quality, affordability, equality and sustainability. Feedback was sought from parents/carers and students in spring 2022. This feedback was summarised in BartholoNews on 22 June 2022. In response to this feedback, we have been working on improvements and liaising with our suppliers and we are excited to announce that there will be some changes to uniform and PE kit coming into effect in the summer. A letter with full details has been emailed to parents/carers; all changes have been made to make our uniform better value, gender neutral and more sustainable.

In order to reduce waste and help parents financially, there will be a long transition period to these changes and therefore, we accept that there will be a period of time when students will be wearing both old and new variations of uniform.

The changes to the school uniform and PE kit will be in place for all Year 7 from September 2023. For other year groups, the existing PE kit can still be purchased, whilst stocks last; indeed, some items are currently offered at discounted prices. The Parents' Association's second hand shop is well-stocked with current uniform, at excellent value, all of which can continue to be worn.

From Cambridge, Georgia is offered a place to study Veterinary Medicine, Maisie, Law and Quin plans to read Mathematics. From Oxford, Abbie has been offered a place to study Classics. Offers are only made after a rigorous and highly competitive entry process of tests and interviews and every one of these applicants deserves their place. The majority of Year 13 students at St Bart's have been applying to universities and higher education courses through the UCAS system for entry later this year, with over 220 applications made by students to date. Mr Wilder, our Senior House Leader, has been running a very successful programme to support students in Years 12 and 13 applying for apprenticeships, offering tailored advice and support on research and applications to those students who are considering this very challenging and competitive route. The Sixth Form has been working closely with local employers, including Vodafone, to support students taking this route, including a forthcoming applicants day at Vodafone HQ.






Martial Arts Club
