

On Friday, St Bart's marked the 1-year anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine with a wreath laying ceremony in the school's Heritage Garden. Laura Farris, MP for Newbury, accompanied members of St Bart's staff and Sixth Form students, including those students who have joined us from Ukraine in the last year, to lay flowers, as the Ukrainian Flag was flown as a mark of respect and solidarity. During the ceremony, three wreaths were laid. One by Ukrainian student, Masha Gomzyakova; another by the Head Students, Alana Campbell and Oliver Davey, on behalf of the school; and the final one by Laura Farris.

Laura Farris spoke of our community's unwavering commitment to supporting the Ukrainian refugees in Newbury, and Year 12 student, Pavlo Binkovskyi, beautifully

read an emotional Ukrainian poem to the assembled community. Following the ceremony, Laura met with Ukrainian students so that they could share their experiences and ask her questions in person.

Mrs Lane, Head of Sixth Form at St Bartholomew's School, said; "the Sixth Form community at St Bart's wanted to stand in solidarity with our Ukrainian students on this difficult day. It's a privilege to have them here".

### **ASTRONOMY AT ST BART'S**




This week students may have seen some of the amazing images that have been shared as parts of the UK were treated to rare glimpses of the Aurora Borealis - caused by particles from the sun colliding with atoms and molecules in our atmosphere. Following the green comet that graced our skies in January, 2023 is certainly already proving to be a year of amazing celestial wonders. Last week, a crescent moon met the solar system's two brightest planets amid their conjunction. The Venus and Jupiter conjunction involves the two planets appearing in close proximity to one another in our night sky. The two planets are in conjunction around every 13 months, but it is more unusual for the conjunction to be readily visible in the evening sky and accompanied by a crescent moon. Dr Fitter captured the moment above St Bart's for all our interested student stargazers.

Venus and Jupiter will be closest together on Wednesday 1 March when they will appear side by side in the evening sky, this is the closest high evening conjunction since

2015 and the next one as good as this isn't until 2047, so one not to miss!

The Year 9 Astronomy GCSE class have most recently been learning about the solar system and how to observe the planets using the nakedeye and with telescopes. The Year 7 and 8 Astronomy Club last week learnt about this

year's Star Count, an annual event run by the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) to map how light pollution is preventing our enjoyment of the night sky, and they have

## St Bart's win Berkshire U18 County Cup Trophy!

The Senior Rugby Team finally got their hands on the Berkshire U18 County Cup Trophy after a hard-fought 15-10 victory over a strong Piggott side, in front of a large crowd at Newbury RFC. Early on, Piggott showed their threat in broken field with some dangerous passages of play, but Bart's scramble defence stood firm with Spencer Codling making some key tackles and Piggott could only come away from their strong start with 3 points. Bart's quickly responded with 3 points of their own from the boot of George Shakespeare after strong carries from Charlie Lewis, Seb Burgess and Cole Whorriskey. Piggott continued to frustrate Bart's at the breakdown, winning numerous turnovers. However,



as the first half wore, on St Bart's started to assert their dominance up front, particularly on the back of a hugely impressive scrum and strong carries through the middle. After a threatening passage down the right of the field and under a penalty advantage, George took advantage of tiring Piggott defenders to put in a pinpoint cross field kick, which Euan Avery gathered to touch down on the left edge, giving St Bart's an 8-3 lead at half time.

Buoyed by the score, St Bart's took full control of the second half, the front row combination of Armand Graham, Haaris Begg, Will Stearn and the returning Oli Davey continued to dominate the set piece, and St Bart's dynamic ball carriers and defensive pressure began to wear Piggott down. The continued pressure, combined with a great territorial kicking game from George and Matis Dessiaume, finally told with Seb Burgess touching down from close range to give St Bart's a 15-3 lead going into the final 10 minutes. After a St Bart's player was sent to the bin, in the last minute Piggott finally managed to break loose and with some fantastic hands and interplay scored to make it a 15-10 scoreline, with St Bart's needing to hold out for one final play to seal the trophy, which they did, forcing an error through a big hit to end the game.

Very well done to all the boys involved both on the night and throughout another successful and thoroughly enjoyable season. Particularly massive congratulations to the Year 13 students who finally win the County Cup after losing two finals previously in Year 10 and 12. The squad now looks forward to the ONA game in March, which, as always, promises to be a fantastic game and occasion.




#### Year 10 Netball
