SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE

To quote one of the Science teachers "Science is the only lesson you can start a fire in and get away with it". Being a Science teacher does have the perks!

In Science there is a large team of dedicated staff, and we really are a team. We work together to give our students the best opportunities both in and out of lessons.





Key Stage 3 Science

Year 7 and 8 form our Key Stage 3 (KS3) in Science. Students learn about topics including Acids and Alkalis, Ecosystems, Space, Reactions of Metals, Electrical Circuits, and Genetics. There are many opportunities for practical work and we have tailored the first two years so that students pick up skills in practical areas over a number of topics. Classes at KS3 have 3 lessons per week, taught by two teachers.

One of the highlights of KS3 is the Science Week assembly. This year, Ms Thomson and Mr Swift did the assembly for Year 7. We had screaming

jelly babies, whoosh bottles, the Van de Graaff generator, amongst many other exciting whizzes and bangs. Mr Swift also had another Whizz-Bang session in his room where he showed other exciting experiments such as the Thermite reaction, used to fix train tracks, and what happens when you put water on a chip pan fire. Students were also treated to balloons, which went bang and had different colour flames! Mrs Woodgate did her famous Pig's head dissection, which was amazing. There are still things which Years 7 and 8 can get involved in this week – Ms Thomson is turning her lab into a pinhole camera with a lot of help from the technicians AND there is still time to get involved in the poster competition.

Key Stage 4 Science

In Year 9 we begin our GCSE and all students study the same course. Students have three lessons per week, which are split between two teachers. Different topics are taught in each of the three Science disciplines, and at the start of the year each student is given a copy of the Science GCSE learning journey, which shows them what they will be learning over the course of their GCSE.

In Years 10 and 11, students have four hours of Science per week. The majority of our students follow the AQA Combined Science: Trilogy course with two classes (one in EP and one in CD) following the AQA Separate Sciences course. All students will be taught Biology, Chemistry and Physics and will also have review lessons built into the course. Students following the Trilogy course will have a double grade for Science whilst those studying separate sciences will obtain a separate grade in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Using this model, our students obtain excellent GCSE results.

And not forgetting GCSE Astronomy, which we offered this year. We have a Year 9 class who have embarked on this course and they are currently taught as an extra lesson after school. Out of lessons, there is always something going on in Science after school. We have Science Club in Year 7, Crest Award in Year 8 and Astronomy in Year 9. For Years 10 and 11 we have Olympiads, Stretch and Challenge (Tuesdays) amongst other activities.

Science is such an amazing subject to learn. Each lesson is different and the opportunities are endless.

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PENGUIN VISITS ST BART'S

Last week Year 9 enjoyed a visit from Helen Garnons-Williams, Publishing Director at Penguin. Helen spoke to the students about her own journey into publishing and the publications she has been personally involved in. She shone a light on the role of a publisher and the skills you needed for this career path – explaining the involved process from manuscript to publication. Helen discussed some of the modern challenges and opportunities for the sector, including social media as a form of advertising and the editing of texts to reflect modern values.



Students also learnt about related careers, such as Book Scouts (tasked with finding books that can make the transition TV or Film) and Cover Designers. It was a fascinating insight into this industry and we would like to thank Helen for so generously sharing her time with St Bart's. We hope the talk has inspired some future publishers, book scouts and cover designers!

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SOCIAL SCIENCES CAREERS MORNING



On Friday 24 March, students in Year 12 and Y13 who study Social Sciences subjects attended a careers morning. They had the opportunity to talk to visitors about careers in the NHS, social care, finance, marketing, law, film and media production. Particularly popular was the outside broadcast truck from Zest4TV. Students had the opportunity to ask about careers in a live broadcast company and see the technology involved in remote production.

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MFL STAFF TRAINING
