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#### WILDFLOWER MEADOW

The wildflower meadow in the St Bart's Nature Reserve is looking great at this time of year. A decade ago, this was simply part of the school field. Now, it has a really high biodiversity and supports many insect species, such as the day-flying moth, the Burnet Companion, and several species of butterfly, such as the Common Blue and the Marbled White. The large area of white flowers is a lovely patch of Meadow Saxifrage, which is quite an unusual sight nowadays. Year 12 Biology students use this area to conduct Biodiversity surveys as part of their A Level study.
