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#### **FOUNDER'S DAY**



Last Wednesday 21 June, our school gathered for the annual St Bart's Founder's Day Assembly. When people come to visit our school, they enter a 21st Century building buzzing with energy and up-todate technology. Yet, it is now 557 years since the founding of our school and we remain a school that both values its history and thrives in the modern world.

To mark the occasion, Dr Fitter reminded our students of the earliest records of St Bart's, which date all the way back to 1466 and of how

a wealthy cloth merchant, Henry Wormestall, left money to pay for a schoolmaster to teach children in the chapel in St Nicolas church.

Our school blazer features a badge with a distinctive cross and the words Ad Lucem, meaning 'Towards the light', along with the school's name in Latin. Schola Sancti Bartholomaei. The cross on the school badge may have derived from the symbol of the medieval charity of St Bartholomew's, whose buildings were originally used to care for the sick and elderly, but were closed down by Henry VIII, enabling them to be repurposed for use as a school.

Students were reminded that the school is so much more than the buildings; it is made up of those who have been part of its history. As a community, Founder's Day is an opportunity to remember these people, and we

welcome those who will share and add to the life of St Bart's in the future.

With this in mind, we then heard from our departing Head Students (22/23), Oliver Davey, Lottie Codling, Lucy Godwin and Ed Morris, who reflected on their experiences, their work with the School Councils and tree planting and gave messages of encouragement for all students to engage fully in school life and embrace all it has to offer.

Finally, our new Head Student team (23/24), Armand Graham, Bella Warner, Jessica Milne, Avni Prashar and Callum Tang, spoke of their own plans to contribute to

St Bart's life. This includes projects such as new whole-school events, helping students to minimise exam stress, working on supporting creative pathways in school, a student-led newspaper and building on student voice. We can't wait to see what they achieve!

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#### **ST BART'S WINS GOLD!**

St Bart's is proud to announce that we have won a Gold School Games Mark. This is a government-led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.

St Bart's have been able to achieve this by offering positive experiences tailored to our students' skills and needs. We have just completed our second year as forerunners of the new look Berkshire PE co-curricular offer. This offer is about maintaining our major sports, but also targets students who have not taken part in sport by offering a greater variety of clubs and opportunities to take part in festivals.



Clubs take place at Activity Time and after school to cater for a variety of year groups and abilities. Some of these are run by St Bart's PE staff, other staff volunteers and specialist external coaches like our Badminton Club, run by Malcolm Taylor, who last year won 'Volunteer of the Year' runner up award from Badminton England. Older students get involved with coaching the younger ones through leadership opportunities within school and the community such as our Sports Leaders programme with a wide and varied range of volunteering opportunities that are beneficial to all involved.

We are very proud to win this award for the opportunities we provide our students to engage in sport and encourage a healthy active lifestyle. The panel also recognised our great tradition of House sports competitions and our participation in competitions and leagues across Berkshire and beyond. Students really enjoy participating in these and get a lot from them so we'd like to thank all the staff members that make these events happen.

The PE Department celebrations will continue with the annual Sports Personality of the Year awards evening on Wednesday 12 July. Tickets are on ParentPay and it'll be first come, first served, so if you have represented the school at any fixture or Dance event, make sure you grab your ticket! Over 100 tickets have already been sold. Awards will include the Sports Personality of the Year for each year group, Coaches' Player of the Year, Most Improved Player and Players' Player for each sport too.

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#### **HOUSE CHESS**

The House Chess Competition for Years 7 to 9 has taken place in June. Davis were the defending champions from 2022, having won the title after a COVID hiatus where the competition was not played. Chess continues to be very popular in the school, with lunchtime Chess Clubs often oversubscribed (especially during the rainy and cold days!). We currently also run an after school Chess Club on a Thursday, which is growing in popularity.

Each House put forward a team of 6 players, with each team playing the other three Houses over three separate days. The matches were fiercely contested between all four Houses, and before the final matches, the early matches were dominated by
