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CARNEGIE AWARD WINNER PARTY

For the past nine weeks, our four enthusiastic Carnegie Medal Shadowing Groups of 40 students in total from Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 have been avidly reading the seven books on this year's shortlist to select what they considered to be the most outstanding book for young people written in the past 18 months. We have met once a week to discuss our thoughts on each book and to try to choose our winner. This year, opinion was divided as to which was the most deserving winner, with the students vigorously defending their choices in



our debates. On Friday 30 June, we celebrated the official Carnegie winner announcement by hosting a party in the Library, and also waited with bated breath to hear from Mr Evans which title our groups had voted was the best.

The shortlist was varied this year, with many different styles of writing and subject matter, and it certainly challenged the students to move outside their normal comfort zone in reading. This is one of the real benefits of the Carnegie Shadowing scheme and we were delighted with the way that all the students embraced the opportunity to read and respond to quality fiction that perhaps they would not have otherwise read. All the students are to be congratulated for their enthusiasm and commitment in taking part in the scheme, and for making our meetings so enjoyable.

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REAL LIFE

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MOTIVATIONAL SPEAKER, CARL KONADU

Last Tuesday, we were delighted to welcome Carl Konadu, entrepreneur, professional speaker and mentor. Carl is wellrespected within the youth sector and supports young people to fulfil their potential with his award-winning social enterprise <u>2-3</u> <u>degrees</u>. He was recognised by HRH Queen Elizabeth II in the 2020 New Year's Honours list, with a British Empire Medal for his contributions to disadvantaged young people during the pandemic.



Carl met with our upcoming Year 12 students in the morning, giving a real buzz to our Sixth Form Induction Days. He spoke of his own

route to success and of how getting poor grades in his own A Levels was a key moment of self-reflection that propelled him to change his attitude and self-application. Carl encouraged our young people to take ownership and feel empowered to take positive action in their learning and lives. Our guest speaker met with our Year 10s for a motivational workshop in which he challenged our students to go from 'failure to first class' by considering 1) you, 2) your work and 3) your environment. Carl also tasked Year 10 students to speak positively about themselves and others in an interactive session. We learnt about the importance of the voice in your head and of the visualisation of your goals. As our Year 10s progress towards their GCSE exam year, we hope they took away some important ideas and tools from the talk, which will help ensure they got the most out of their coming years with St Bart's. YEAR 8 CRITICAL THINKING WORKSHOP

On Monday 25 June, I attended a Stretch and Challenge workshop on Critical Thinking. In the workshop, we learned about the credibility of someone and to what extent we can trust a source. We used an acronym called RAVEN which stands for Reputation, Ability to see, Vested interests (do they have something to gain from it), Expertise and Neutrality. It was great to see how to tell if we can trust the source and I think this will be really helpful in evaluating evidence in the future.

We also spent some time learning about Socrates and the Socratic method of questioning. This is where you ask someone a question to make them question their own argument. This helps to illustrate the flaws in their own argument and encourages them to try and rethink and restructure it. It showed us a more effective way to argue; calmly, reflectively and respectfully. We thank Miss Marshall, who provides these opportunities, and Mr Langton for leading the workshop.
