Every year the UCL Centre for Holocaust Education looks to recruit up to 20 secondary schools in England committed to enhancing teaching and learning about the Holocaust. As reported in BartholoNews during the Summer Term, we are delighted that St Bart's have been chosen as part of the 2023/2024 cohort. We believe that forming a partnership with the Centre of Holocaust Education at UCL will be a highly rewarding experience and a fantastic opportunity, which will benefit our students and staff.



As part of the project, St Bart's are launching a brand new enrichment group, which through the analysis of secondary sources and testimony explores Noemie Lopian's family and their survival during the Holocaust. Using the television programme 'My Family, The Holocaust and Me', the group will embark on a journey of discovery, whilst completing a number of activities, which have been created by the Centre of Holocaust Education at UCL. By the end of the programme, students will have further developed their understanding of this period in history, whilst also making new friends from across the school.
