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IMPERIAL WAR MUSEUM LEARNING EXPERIENCE

During half term, Miss May (KS3 History Lead and Holocaust Beacon School Co-Lead Teacher) went on the Holocaust Beacon School residential weekend in London. The weekend started at the Imperial War Museum where Miss May had the opportunity to meet other lead teachers who were part of programme and visit the Holocaust galleries at the museum. The Holocaust galleries were really powerful and focused on Jewish people and their lives, as well as their experience of the Nazi persecution and the Holocaust through letters, their belongings and other documents.



Day two and three of the residential took place at UCL, and Miss May was given the opportunity to work with experts and academics, focusing on misconceptions about the Holocaust and how we should teach the Holocaust. Miss May also started to plan the History department's new Holocaust scheme of work, which will be taught to Year 9 students next year (current Year 8).



The final day involved a trip to the Wiener Library, which provides access to many primary sources in relation to the Holocaust. The library allows you to find out about Jewish people and their experiences through photos, letters, diary entries and other sources. Miss May hopes to include many of these sources within the History department's new scheme of work.

Miss May learnt a lot during this weekend and is looking forward to using all of the resources to develop Holocaust education at St Bart's.


Evers students have been raising money for West Berks MENCAP.

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ALL YOURS PERIOD BOXES

All Yours is a local organisation, set up in 2020 to provide some boxes of period products for people in our local community who are struggling to afford or access period products.

They provide two types of boxes - adult boxes and boxes for teenagers/children who are just getting to grips with their periods. These boxes contain day and night period pads designed specifically for younger bodies. The last posting dates for Royal Mail mean that the



deadline for ordering All Yours boxes in time for Christmas is quite early this year, so you need to request boxes by Thursday 7 December if you need it to receive them before Christmas.
