ST BARTHOLOMEW'S SCHOOL, NEWBURY, RG20 0HP 16-19 Tuition Fund, 2022-3

This document outlines how St Bartholomew's School, Newbury is using additional funding to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

INTENT St Bartholomew's school will be using the catch up funding in a combination of ways. Study Skills Support We will be using mainly small group tuition as an approach to delivering a combination of Exam Skills, Study Skills and subject specific expert support.

The intent of this approach is to address any shortfall in the level of academic skills for success needed within 6th form education to Y12 and Y13 students who experienced considerable disruption in their KS4 years. The study skills support will also be extended to Y13 where there is evidence of a specific skills deficit and need identified under the funding guidelines.

Subject Support (small group sessions) A secondary focus will be on providing some support - principally through small groups - at a subject level. Delivered by subject specialists, this will complement timetabled lessons, providing opportunities for catch up, and importantly also to consolidate new learning. This will encompass both Y12 and Y13 students and cover those eligible for funding under the guidelines, particularly those

One-to-one Support - this will be provided to students from disadvantaged groups.

DELIVERY As outlined above, we are also using the fund to provide non subject specific support to students. This will take the form of small group sessions on a range of academic skills for success including: Exam Revision, Organisation, Consolidation of learning outside of the classroom, Analysis and Evaluation, Motivation and Wellbeing.

Alongside this, there will be targeted subject revision, focusing on areas of greatest need for the students eligible for support. This will prioritise Maths and English for students resitting these subjects and it is intended that this work will facilitate their progress in other subjects.

STAFFING We anticipate that the majority of our provision in subjects will come from our own fully qualified teaching staff and that this work will be within their own subject specialisms. We will also be enlisting the involvement of colleagues across the school, notably within the Sixth Form leadership team, our pastoral teams and our Personalised Learning team to provide Study Skills support

Furthermore we are currently receiving quotes from external organisations who will be able to provide various packages of support and tuition that we are looking to engage with if we feel that they add value to our existing in-house capabilities.
