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#### **BLETCHLEY PARK TRIP**

On Thursday 25 March, we took 61 GCSE and A Level students to Bletchley Park. Once the top-secret home of The World War Two Codebreakers, Bletchley Park was a fascinating place to visit with its immersive films and interactive displays. Each of our groups had a separate itinerary for the day, so on arrival, Year 12 made straight for their workshop, whilst Year 10 headed off on a guided tour of the facility. Graham, the guide, was incredibly knowledgeable and really brought the history of Bletchley Park to life. Anya (Y10) said, "I really enjoyed it. It was my second time going and I learnt way more with the guide and going there with my friends made it a much more enjoyable experience"





The workshops were held in Block E, which was once Bletchley Park's World War Two communications centre where they handled incoming and outgoing messages, encryption using machines such as Typex, and the distribution of material throughout the organisation. The Year 12 workshop on Past, Present and Future Encryption looked at the principles that have led to secure modern day encryption and sending messages using symmetrical and asymmetrical methods, before discussing the future of cryptography with a focus on Quantum Computing. Verity (Y12) said, "The Bletchley Park trip was a really good opportunity to understand the practical applications of what we learn in class, and the influences of World War Two on the history of computing."

The Year 10 workshop focused on Codes and Ciphers. From Ancient Greece to the modern day, people have been using increasingly complex codes and ciphers with the intention of communicating secretly and keeping information secure. The students enjoyed the rare opportunity to use a genuine Enigma machine and worked together to decipher messages during their challenge to crack six different codes in 15 minutes. Some of the codes they had to crack included transposition, Caesar and rail fence ciphers.

During their exploration time, students got the chance to learn more about the Bombe machines and they also visited some of the special exhibitions, including the Intelligence factory and the Art of Data exhibit. Overall, it was an excellent day out, as expressed by Charlie (Y10), "I had a really good time, it was a very interesting trip and would consider re-visiting".





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#### IAIN DALE VISITS ST BART'S

On Friday 26 April, an audience of Citizenship, Politics, History and Law students from Year 10-13 welcomed political journalist Iain Dale for a discussion about the state of politics.

lain has had many years of experience in the political sphere, meeting every prime minister since James Callaghan. A radio presenter for LBC, he also regularly makes appearances on Good Morning Britain. He has also chaired Conservative party leadership debates and is a former parliamentary candidate.

After some opening remarks from Iain, Mr Langton then went straight to some student questions. Questions revolved around what to expect from the general election this year and about Iain's interview experiences. Who was the most frustrating person to question and what makes a good dialogue?

The session was recorded for Mr Langton, Mr Castel and Mr Wilder's 'Politips' podcast which they have been producing for over a year now. Although primarily aimed at A Level Politics students, it's interesting to anyone with an interest in politics or current affairs. #### 1st XI Cricket: derby-day victory

Our highest-ever total of the new era (198-3) was recorded as a plucky Park House side and the increasingly persistent rain were beaten by a dominant 1st XI — the victory putting us into the final of the Toby Radford Trophy, although our opponents are yet to be determined. In truth, the game was rather a mismatch, but Bart's batted with such authority that it was a little disappointing not to break the 200 barrier. Everyone was a bit surprised when skipper Seb was bowled by a full toss for a masterly 28 off 14 balls, but Y10 Ray continued on his merry way to score 75 off 50 balls — his hooking and pulling being highlights — registering the second highest individual score since the reboot of cricket at this level in 2022. He was ably assisted by Y11 Vivaan's run-a-ball 48 not out and Y10 Leo's breezy 20 off 9 balls. Park House managed 66 in reply, but they never gave up or let their heads drop. Y12 Tom picked up 4-10 (the best bowling figures of recent times) and Y10 keeper Ava grabbed three catches; the last one, being the last wicket, was fittingly taken off her Y12 brother James's bowling, as he chipped in with 2-9. Y12 Jake also bagged a brace.


