#### DAVIS THIRD TIME HOUSE CHAMPIONS!

Last week in our first full school assembly, students waited to hear the results of last year's House Championship. Our Houses have a fantastic history stretching back over 100 years and this decades' old competition is an integral part.

In the 2023/24 Sport Shield, covering over 150 matches and 13 different sports, Davis were victorious with Curnock narrowly pipping Evers and Patterson to 2<sup>nd</sup>.

The Citizenship Shield considers attendance, awards and charity work, and Patterson beat off contenders, Evers, to win this for the second year running!



The Arts and Enrichment Shield was won by Curnock, having swept the board in House Drama, Dance, Arts and Junior Film competitions.



The Sixth Form Cup is competed for by Sixth Form students only, and includes various leadership opportunities, report scores and Sixth Form sports became another tussle between the top two houses, with Davis edging the win over Curnock.

The Academic Shield is the final component decided, with exam results and milestones considered as they come in. Again, Davis were victorious with Evers coming in 2<sup>nd</sup>.

So, overall Davis is our worthy winner, taking the House Championship Cup for an incredible third time.

#### **EXAM RESULTS TO CELEBRATE**

We are again celebrating another year of fantastic exam performance by last years' Year 11 and Year 13 cohort. The progress made by Year 11 students from when they started with us in Year 7 was once again extremely high and they deserve to be immensely proud of their achievements. Their hard work and dedication, supported by their parents and their teachers, has truly paid dividends.

At GCSE, over 83% of all grades were at grade 4 or higher and over 35% were at grade 7 or higher. A total of 54 students achieved at least 8 GCSEs at grade 7 or higher, with Lily Walke, Arpit Bhabra,

Isaac Rutter, Megan Purcell, Martha Fitch, Shreya Tripathi, Jacob Glendenning, Sam Dickens and Clara Zeferino achieving an extraordinary total of 70 grade 9s between them. The cohorts' performance ensures that students can smoothly progress to further study, with all doors open to them.



In Year 13, 30% of all grades achieved were at A\* to A, with 10% of all grades being A\*, and over 79% of grades were C or better. 45 students gained at least 3 A\*/A grades or better, with 11 achieving at least 3 A\*. Special mention must be made of the achievement of Alex Scourfield, Eleanor Jeffery, Edmund Tyler and Miguel Zeferino who all gained at least four A\* grades.

Six students who held offers from Oxford or Cambridge have the grades required to start their courses. More than 200 St Bartholomew's students will be taking up places at universities across the country and many others have secured places on competitive apprenticeship programmes. Whether students have progressed to St Bart's Sixth Form, taken up places at college, university or on an apprenticeship programme, or are travelling other new pathways, we wish them all the very best as they move on to the next stage of their lives. Their successes lie not just in their academic progress, but also in the way in which they have been a real asset to the school as a whole, acting as excellent role models who have made a really positive contribution to the wider school community.

#### **CALCULATORS**

All students in Years 7 to 11 should have a calculator with them as part of their school equipment every day. Year 7 students will not require a calculator in Maths until at least the week beginning 23 September this term.

For Maths, students require a calculator with standard scientific functions. An appropriate calculator can be purchased via the <u>parentpay shop</u>

Note that the calculators for Year 9 to 11 sold via parentpay are different to the ones for Years 7 and 8, as Casio have changed their range, and while the old and new ones have all the same features there are some significant differences in how they work.

Students in Years 9 to 11 can purchase calculators which work in the style they are used to via the parentpay shop, rather than having to learn a new interface. These are no longer available in most shops.

Year 7 and 8 will be taught how to use the new style calculators, so should purchase the newer ones (listed as for Year 7 and 8).

Sixth form students will be advised by their class teachers on whether and what calculator is needed. Students taking Maths in the sixth form will be able to purchase an appropriate calculator through school later in September.

Please contact your child's Maths teacher if you are not sure what they require.



#### JESSIE SELECTED FOR ENGLAND CAMP


