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2024 HARVEST APPEAL

For this year's Harvest appeal, we are continuing to stay loyal to two brilliant local charities, Loose Ends and the Fair Close Centre.

Loose Ends is a fantastic drop-in centre in Newbury, run by volunteers, which has served over 5000 meals and distributed more than 2500 food parcels in the past year. The Fair Close Centre provide food, activities and entertainment to our elderly community. They have also started a drop-in centre for families who are struggling and have arranged with West Berkshire Action for Refugees to allow them to share our facilities once a week so they can



organize cooking sessions for asylum seekers currently living in hotels so that they can cook and eat together as there are no cooking facilities or communal dining areas in the hotels

We spoke in the whole school assembly to encourage the school community to donate to help people in need. The suggested donations are:

- Tins of meat, fish, beans, vegetables and soup
- Tins of evaporated milk, custard, rice pudding and fruit
- Jars of jam and pasta sauce.
- Biscuits and tea bags
- Pasta and rice
- · Cartons of long-life juice, and long-life milk
- Toiletries

JOHN WRIGHT

St Bart's was very sad to learn of the death of former St Bart's teacher, John Wright (aged 86), on September 26 in Basingstoke Hospital.

A distinguished scholar, John Wright arrived at the Newbury County Girls Grammar School in 1965 as the first male teacher to join the Girls' School. He taught Scripture (known to our current students as Religious Studies) and then retrained - spending the rest of his career teaching Sociology at A Level.

In 1975 when the School amalgamated with the Boys' School, to become the St Bartholomew's School we know today, John quickly made his mark. He was made Head of Evers House, a post he held for four years, during which time he injected his own brand of enthusiasm and clear values, with all students benefitting from his inspirational leadership. However, it was in his role as Senior Teacher in charge of behaviour for Years 7-11 that he made his greatest impact. He shaped the day-to-day running of school life with his vigorous and committed approach, which in turn promoted a sense of honesty and fair play.


Undoubtedly many former students, colleagues and parents will mourn his passing but his memory will always live on.

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OXBRIDGE ALUMNI RETURN TO INSPIRE OUR STRETCH & CHALLENGE YEAR 10 STUDENTS

Last week, we were pleased to be able to offer our Year 10 students, on the Stretch & Challenge programme, an opportunity to take part in a Q&A session with our very own Oxbridge panel. The panel consisted of alumnus Siena Hickmore, who recently graduated from University of Oxford with a degree in History, alumnus Miguel Zeferino who left St Bart's this summer to start his degree in Engineering with the University of Cambridge and Imogen Ciochon, who is a current St Bart's Year



13 student and planning to study Experimental Psychology at the University of Oxford.

This was a fantastic opportunity for our Year 10s to put their questions to Siena, Miguel and Imogen - students who, not so very long ago, sat where the Year 10s are now sitting and who have first-hand and recent experience of aspiring to, and ultimately successfully achieving, a place/offer for Oxbridge.

Questions included:

- · What A Levels did they study?
- · What they found hardest about the application process?
- How hopeful they had been about their application?
- What advice they would give their Year 10 self?
- Do you need to appear confident during an application?
- · What is it important to include in your application and how do you make it stand out?
- How do you budget at university?
- · How much independence do you have in Sixth Form and at University?
- And even, what houses they were/are in? Siena (Curnock), Miguel (Davis), Imogen (Evers)!

Advice given by our panellists included finding a subject or area that truly interests you, so that you are prepared to work hard and explore beyond the curriculum. They also explained the importance of super-curricular activities, namely researching, engaging and reading around your chosen subject. They advised the students that you can always choose to change to your pathway at some point in your journey and that it isn't about achieving straight 9s but about demonstrating your passion for your subject/s and how you think around ideas and challenges. We heard about Miguel's drone that can now 'almost' fly after many



failed attempts and about Imogen's earlier life experience that sparked her desire to learn more about how



brains work. Siena also spoke about life at Oxford and the independence you have in your study and daily life.

We hope the Year 10s who took part were inspired to start thinking about where their own interests could take them. We'd like to extend our grateful thanks to Siena, Miguel and Imogen for taking the time to engage with those following in their footsteps.
