Flu Vaccinations Reminder


REMINDER: Flu vaccinations will take place in school for Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 students on Monday 25 November 2024.

A <u>Flu information leaflet</u> and an <u>E-Consent Flu letter</u> from the Berkshire School Aged Immunisation Team are available on the links above.

If you would like your child to receive their Flu vaccination in school, please **complete a consent form as soon** as **possible or by 9.00am**, one full school day before the vaccination session, at the latest.

If you **do not** wish your child to be vaccinated, please still **follow the consent QR** code and there is an option to <u>'not' consent. (3rd/4th page)</u>.

BONKERS CONKERS AT ST BART'S

For over two centuries, schoolchildren have enjoyed a quintessentially British autumn pastime: Conkers. In this time-honoured contest, conkers (or horse chestnuts) are carefully drilled and strung, and then participants take turns striking their opponent's chestnut until one is shattered.

Last Wednesday, St Bart's held our first official Conker Championship. Meticulous preparation preceded the event, with Charlie Byatt (8P2) precisely drilling conkers and Tiana Viljoen – Kadziya (9C1), Isabell Harvey (8E1) and Maisie MacDonald (11P3) assisting with stringing.



The competition spanned multiple year groups, culminating in a thrilling final between Year 7 student Joseph Breslin and Sixth Former Yuvaa Narayanan. After an intense battle of skill and strategy, Joseph Breslin emerged victorious, his conker surviving an impressive five matches.



We were also incredibly lucky to have been joined by Derek Brown, a St Bart's alumnus who played Conkers during his school days. Derek not only taught participants the traditional rules but also helped resolve any gameplay disputes and presented the winner with a large wooden conker lovingly crafted by Mr Turner in our 3D Design team.

Following the success of this year's event, we hope to expand the competition next year, possibly adding it to the House Championship, so watch this space! Special thanks also to the Sixth Form students, Will Heslop, Ayla Wilding, Yuvaa Narayanan and Sid Karra - whose support was instrumental in making this event a memorable success.

"This is my second season with England. I got scouted and given a trial at the National Performance League tournament 2023. I then did the whole season and was selected for the Netball Europe 2024 in Gibraltar, where I got my first four official junior caps for England.

I was reselected for a trial at the start of this netball season from the same tournament, went to the trial and was offered a place in the Rose Academy

for the second year. In the coming months I will continue to attend England Netball camps, which take place every two weeks or up to a month until selection comes for the Europe Netball 2025 squad. Netball Europe with be held in Belfast (March 2025)."
