They also visited a Year 12 German class, and joined Year 9s completing a German quiz around the MFL department.

Other speakers included Dr Ian Ellison, a post- doctoral researcher on the Kafka's Transformative Communities Project at the University of Oxford and a Visiting Fellow at Wadham College; Wayne Morse, a recruitment specialist from BMW; Gregor Kleinknecht, founder partner at MEUM Law in London; and Anna Bawden, Health and Social Affairs Correspondent at the Guardian.

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### **KEW GARDENS TRIPS**



A few weeks ago, our Year 9 Geographers visited Kew Gardens in London, exploring the Palm House, Temperate House and Princess of Wales House as part of their new topic 'Fragile Ecosystems'.

Throughout the day, students discovered the life-saving capabilities of plants, got a birds-eye view of the plant acrobatics of the rainforest and gained a better understanding of the threats humans are posing to our ecosystems. They even exemplified our 'Brave' value as they scaled the dizzy heights of the Treetop Walkway and collected questionnaire data from willing members of the public. All of this forms part of a fieldwork enquiry that students have continued in lessons.



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#### **AWARD-WINNING AUTHOR VISIT**

The award-winning author Ele Fountain visited us last Thursday to meet Year 7 and Year 8 students. Ele's books explore subjects such as friendship, family, hope and loss. Boy 87 relates to themes students study in English, such as headlines in journalism, as well as being connected to other subjects such as Geography, History and Citizenship Studies. This was a wonderful opportunity to see how reading can directly support the curriculum as well as being a chance to celebrate reading.

Ele has a real gift for weaving real-world issues into genuinely thrilling adventure stories and she kept us all riveted as she talked about Boy 87, explained how she



came to write the book, why she is an author and how she writes a book. There was time for a Question and Answer session at the end, and our St Bart's students asked some very insightful questions! We were very proud of how well-behaved and invested our students were.

Librarian, Mrs Hewetson, said: "Ele's visit was inspirational for our students and really helped to bring her book, Boy 87, alive. She covered so many topics, from the book's themes, asking the students to put themselves in the characters' shoes, discussing her writing process and talking about authors in general. It was wonderful to see the students fascinated by different aspects of the talk and to understand how anyone can be a writer."

After the talks, students who wanted a Boy 87 book were treated to a book-signing session in the Library with the author. Ele said, "I spent a wonderful day with Year 7 and Year 8. They were engaged, inquisitive, and asked so many wonderful questions!"

Sofiia (7P2) said, "When I came into the hall to listen to Ele Fountain's talk I was nervous because I had never met an author before. I am not a person that loves books a lot, but when Ele read the first few pages of her book I knew that this was one that I wanted to read. I have already started it and I love it. I really enjoyed meeting Ele Fountain last week."

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### FOOD SCIENCE FASCINATES ASSEMBLY

In this assembly we looked at the fascinating world of food science with some experiments that demonstrated the incredible properties of everyday foods. I was assisted by Ash (8E1) and Josie (8C3) to make ice cream using milk, ice cubes and salt. Whilst they took turns to shake a very cold bag, Alice (8D2) came on stage to help me with a second experiment.

We put a raw egg in a measuring jug and covered it with white vinegar. Alice described the white film that appeared immediately over the surface of the egg. This film was actually very small bubbles of carbon dioxide gas. As this experiment takes several days, I had two eggs that I had prepared earlier.



What we observed was remarkable. The vinegar, which is an acid, (acetic acid), had dissolved the calcium carbonate found in the eggshell. The shell, which usually protects the egg, dissolved away entirely, leaving behind only a soft, translucent membrane. I think everyone agreed that the residue left in the vinegar was pretty yukky! I could see how rubbery the egg was.

We also recreated a volcano using bicarbonate of soda and vinegar, which for effect I had coloured with food colouring. Again, it was carbon dioxide that was the star of the show, with a bubbling mass of 'lava'.

Alice helped make a bowl of Oobleck, which the students correctly identified as a non-Newtonian fluid, otherwise known as cornflour and water mixed in the correct proportions to produce a solid. Alice was able to mould in her hand then pour it back into the bowl.



Meanwhile Ash and Josie were getting very cold hands but unfortunately, the experiment was not successful, as the milk did not freeze as expected. I do hope they enjoyed trying however.

The assembly ended with me experimenting how strong the rubbery egg was and Year 8 certainly enjoyed seeing that it wasn't as bouncy as it looked as it smashed on the floor, creating a bit of a mess. I particularly enjoyed hearing the suggestion by one of the students as he left, that I should have dropped the egg into the Oobleck to see it would protect the egg. What a show of enthusiasm and involvement!

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# **ULAFU SECONDARY, KENYA UPDATE**

We recently had a Zoom meeting with our partnership school, Ulafu Secondary in Kenya, deepening our collaboration to address key issues affecting the students and community.

The group has grown significantly, however one of the key areas the students of Ulafu are focusing on is gender inequality, a critical issue within their community. Although the group has been male-dominated, both schools are committed to addressing this imbalance by raising awareness and brainstorming solutions to promote gender equality.



Last year, the partnership group raised an impressive 165,470 Kenyan Shillings (£988) through various fundraising activities. Kennedy, the lead teacher, and the Ulafu Secondary students expressed their heartfelt gratitude for the generous donation, which has had a significant impact on their school and community. The funds have been used to purchase gardening tools, plant trees and provide food for meals, directly benefiting both students and local families.

This contribution has also played a role in supporting Ulafu Secondary's sustainable projects. With the aid of the donation, the school was able to establish a kitchen garden and buy seeds and tools needed to cultivate crops.

Kennedy shared that the school had recently faced the challenges of a drought, but thankfully, the rains have returned, enabling the school to continue their agricultural work. Alongside farming, the students have begun producing soaps and mats, which they sell to raise additional funds for the school. These initiatives not only provide financial support but also help develop valuable skills among the students.

Moving forward, Ulafu Secondary School is focused on sustainable development goals with a particular focus on zero hunger as well as gender inequality, which remains a priority.

St. Bart's is proud to support Ulafu Secondary in their efforts to build a brighter future for all students, and both schools look forward to continuing their collaboration in the coming year. Through mutual dedication and ongoing support, the schools are committed to making a positive impact, one that empowers young people to create meaningful change in their communities.
