GCSEs and BTECs

GCSEs

- All GCSE courses now have linear assessment. No GCSE exams will be taken earlier than May of 2026 by the current Year 9 students.
- There are a few GCSE courses which include some Non-Examined Assessment (NEA).
- For the most part, however, GCSEs are exam-based.

BTECs - Tech Awards (Level 2)

- Each vocational course is made up of a number of components, allowing students to build up their qualification in stages.
- Students are assessed through Pearson Set Assignments (PSAs) which are set twice a year and the final Component is assessed by an external 'exam'

Learning which is applied to 'real life ' contexts:

e.g. sport or the health sector; activities such as research and team work on a project

The English Baccalaureate

GCSE 9-5 passes in:

- English
- Maths
- Science x 2
- MFL
- History or Geography

This measure is now calculated as an average score across the six subject areas.

Only a measure which is used by the Government in the information which they publish about schools. It is not a qualification in itself which students are required to have.

Slightly Differentiated Guides

- <u>Core Skills</u>: These three periods will focus on aspects of Literacy and Numeracy that will underpin and support students' work in English Language, Mathematics and other subjects across the curriculum. The programme is designed to help students to maximise the grades they achieve in these vital subjects while also developing work and life skills that will support them as they prepare for post-16 options.
- Core Skills Plus = Core Skills plus an additional lesson of targeted support

- Please note that only students in sets 9 and 8/7 for Maths may select Computer Science as their Group Two choice.
