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#### **BRITISH PHYSICS OLYMPIAD CHALLENGES 2024/25**

It's been another busy year with St Bart's students taking on the challenges of the British Physics Olympiad (BPhO). Students from Years 8, 10, 11, 12 and 13 took part in a range of written and online challenges. As usual, the challenges have tested the students' problem solving skills, taking them above and beyond their current level. If you are interested, past papers from the written challenges are freely available on the <a href="BPhO website">BPhO website</a>. As they say on the front, the papers are designed to be difficult; often 50% is enough for a Gold Award.



The Year 11, 12 and 13 written challenges proved particularly tricky this year. In Year 13, congratulations go to **Aayush Joshi** who achieved a Silver Award, and **Nikhil Kopparapu** and **Sid Karra** who both achieved Bronze 1 Awards. Five students achieved Silver Awards in Year 12: **Noah Radley, Jomiloju Badaki, Isaac Rutter, Deenuka Worrall** and **Will Fortmuller**. There were 10 other Bronze Awards. For the Year 11 written paper our highest achieving student was **Timmy Wraight** with a Silver Award. Otherwise in Year 11 there were 5 Bronze 1 and 8 Bronze 2 Awards.

The online challenges consist of multiple choices questions divided into two 25-minute sections. All Physics Year 12 A-level students took their version. A Gold Award was achieved by **Amogh Kasetty**. There were also 10 Silvers and 34 Bronzes.

At Years 10 and 11, all Separate Science students sit their online challenges. In Year 11 there were 7 Gold Awards, the highest total scores were **Logan Wakefield** and **Joe Herriman**. Year 10 students achieved a massive

18 Gold Awards, with **Chris Broadfoot** gaining the highest total. All other students achieved either a Silver or Bronze Award. When compared to national results, St Bart's students' average score compares very favourably with other schools.

An exclusive group of Year 8 students took their online challenge this year. The majority of those that entered achieved a Gold Award, with the remainder gaining a Silver. The student with the highest total score was **Nila Arulmurugan**.

Congratulations to all those who took part. There has been a significant boost in confidence for those many students who achieved higher level awards. I look forward to them taking on challenges in the future.

### Years of Service at St Bartholomew's School 1974 - 2009

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#### **BELIZE HIGH COMMISSION WORK EXPERIENCE**

During half term, on Wednesday 28 to Friday 30 May, Josh (12E1) completed 3 days of work experience at the Belize High Commission in London. He has written us a report about his experiences:

"I reached out to the High Commissioner, as an opportunity like this would give a real-world sense and understanding of how an embassy works, the Diplomatic systems and International Relations.

On the first day, I helped to organise the first events at the newly renovated offices. First, we hosted CARICOM, with 24 attendees, including High Commissioners from every Caribbean country. I helped to serve traditional Belizean dishes such as Chicken, Rice and Beans and a selection of salads. Additionally, I laid out folders with information of the event and set the tables.

Secondly, Oxford's Diplomatic Studies cohort visited for a panel talk from the High Commissioner and the First Secretary. I was also invited to join the talk and learnt about some international issues that Belize and surrounding countries currently face, as well as domestic issues in Belize. The First Secretary, Jordan Allis Craig, explained how she was recruited on a young team to campaign for the Belizean referendum which would decide the future of the Guatemala's Territorial, Insular and Maritime Claim (Guatemala/Belize) dispute. Furthermore, she explained how she has to analyse and have an in-depth understanding of disputes and conflicts across the globe.



On the second day, I was able to chat further with the other staff members of the Belize High Commission, including the Consular, who showed me how they biometrically process Belizean passports through an international database of every registered Belizean (which included a very embarrassing younger picture of myself!).

On the third day, I had the pleasure of speaking with the First Secretary of the Belize High Commission, Ms Jordan, who gave me an even deeper understanding of what it is like to be a Diplomat and in a position within the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Belize. In addition to this she helped me to think about what I would like to do and got me thinking about which future career I would like to pursue.

Across these 3 days, I have developed a basic insight of the role that an Embassy plays, as well as the different positions of staff that create the High Commission. Not only did I get the chance to meet some extraordinary people but I was able to get a sense of my own Belizean roots."

Some of them constructed bivouacs whilst others sandwiched themselves between two groundsheets.



It did rain during the evening but they were undeterred and continued to race around the Thirtover site finding out about why veterans are particularly vulnerable to homelessness, as we tried to dispel some of the myths around this issue.

All of the Guides remained sleeping outside all night (some slept more than others!) which we were all really impressed by. The leaders also slept out in their own bivouac. We all commented what an absolute pleasure it was to take part in this event with these girls, who all demonstrated team work, determination, resilience and

courageous advocacy. They even managed to stay dry!



In total, the group raised a huge amount of money and have been given an award as a result. We hope that they will continue to prove that girls can do anything whilst they are members of Guiding and into the future."

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
